HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 536

A bill to amend 1989 PA 196, entitled

"An act to abolish the criminal assessments commission; to prescribe certain duties of the crime victim services commission; to create the crime victim's rights fund; to provide for expenditures from the fund; to provide for assessments against criminal defendants and certain juvenile offenders; to provide for payment of crime victim's rights services; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies and departments,"

by amending sections 1 and 5 (MCL 780.901 and 780.905), section 1 as amended by 2008 PA 396 and section 5 as amended by 2010 PA 281.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Commission" means the crime victim services commission
- 3 described in section 2 of 1976 PA 223, MCL 18.352.
- 4 (b) "Crime victim's rights services" means services required
- 5 to implement fully the William Van Regenmorter crime victim's

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- 1 rights act, 1985 PA 87, MCL 780.751 to 780.834, and services
- prescribed under this act.
- 3 (c) "Department" means the department of management and budget
- 4 of this state. COMMUNITY HEALTH.
- 5 (d) "Felony" means a violation of a penal law of this state
- 6 for which the offender, upon conviction, may be punished by
- 7 imprisonment for more than 1 year or an offense expressly
- 8 designated by law to be a felony.
- 9 (e) "Fund" means the crime victim's rights fund created under
- 10 section 4.
- 11 (f) "Juvenile offense" means an offense committed by a
- 12 juvenile under the jurisdiction of the juvenile division of the
- 13 probate court or the family division of circuit court under section
- 14 2(a)(1) of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288,
- 15 MCL 712A.2, that if committed by an adult would be a felony,
- 16 serious misdemeanor, or a specified misdemeanor ORDINANCE
- 17 VIOLATION, if the juvenile's case is not designated as a case in

- 22 (h) "Specified misdemeanor" means a misdemeanor violation of

- 25 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.602a, 257.625, 257.626, and

- 15 (ix) Section 174, 218, 356, 356d, 359, 362, 362a, 377a, 380,
- 16 479a, 535, or 540e of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL
- 17 750.174, 750.218, 750.356, 750.356d, 750.359, 750.362, 750.362a,
- 18 750.377a, 750.380, 750.479a, 750.535, and 750.540e.
- 19 (x) A local ordinance substantially corresponding to a law
- 20 listed in subparagraphs (i) to (ix).
- 21 Sec. 5. (1) The court shall order each person charged with an
- 22 offense that is a felony, a serious misdemeanor, or a specified
- 23 misdemeanor, ORDINANCE VIOLATION that is resolved by conviction, by
- 24 assignment of the defendant to youthful trainee status, by a
- 25 delayed sentence or deferred entry of judgment of guilt, or in
- 26 another way that is not an acquittal or unconditional dismissal, to
- 27 pay an assessment as follows:

- 1 (a) If the offense is a felony, \$130.00.
- 2 (b) If the offense is a misdemeanor OR ORDINANCE VIOLATION,
- **3** \$75.00.
- 4 (2) The court shall order a defendant to pay only 1 assessment

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- 5 under subsection (1) per criminal case. Payment of the assessment
- 6 shall be a condition of a probation order entered under chapter XI
- 7 of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 771.1 to
- 8 771.14a, or a parole order entered under section 36 of the
- 9 corrections code of 1953, 1953 PA 232, MCL 791.236.
- 10 (3) The court shall order each juvenile for whom the court
- 11 enters an order of disposition for a juvenile offense to pay an
- 12 assessment of \$25.00. The court shall order a juvenile to pay only
- 13 1 assessment under this subsection per case.
- 14 (4) Except as otherwise provided under this act, an assessment
- 15 under this section shall be used to pay for crime victim's rights
- 16 services.
- 17 (5) If a defendant ordered to pay an assessment under this act
- 18 posted a cash bond or bail deposit in connection with the case, the
- 19 court shall order the assessment collected out of that bond or
- 20 deposit as provided in section 15 of chapter V and section 22 of
- 21 chapter XV of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL
- 22 765.15 and 775.22, or section 6 or 7 of 1966 PA 257, MCL 780.66 and
- **23** 780.67.
- 24 (6) If a person is subject to any combination of fines, costs,
- 25 restitution, assessments, or payments arising out of the same
- 26 criminal or juvenile proceeding, money collected from that person
- 27 for the payment of fines, costs, restitution, assessments, or other

- 1 payments shall be allocated as provided in section 22 of chapter XV
- 2 of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 775.22, or
- 3 section 29 of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA
- 4 288, MCL 712A.29.
- 5 (7) The clerk of the court shall do both of the following on
- 6 the last day of each month:
- 7 (a) Transmit 90% of the assessments received under this
- 8 section to the department of treasury with a written report of
- 9 those assessments as the department of treasury prescribes. To
- 10 provide funding for costs incurred under this section and for
- 11 providing crime victim's rights services, the court may retain 10%
- 12 of the assessments received under this section and transmit that
- 13 amount to the court's funding unit.
- 14 (b) Transmit a written report to the department on a form the
- 15 department prescribes containing all of the following information
- 16 for that month:
- 17 (i) The name of the court.
- 18 (ii) The total number of criminal convictions or dispositions
- 19 for offenses that if committed by an adult would be criminal
- 20 obtained in that court.
- 21 (iii) The total number of defendants or juveniles against whom
- 22 an assessment was imposed by that court.
- (iv) The total amount of assessments imposed by that court.
- (v) The total amount of assessments collected by that court.
- (vi) Other information required by the department.
