HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 596

A bill to create the human trafficking health advisory board act; to provide for an interdepartmental human trafficking health advisory board; to prescribe the membership of the human trafficking health advisory board; and to prescribe the duties and responsibilities of the human trafficking health advisory board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "human
- 2 trafficking health advisory board act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Board" means the human trafficking health advisory board
- 5 created in section 3.
- 6 (b) "Human trafficking" means a violation of chapter LXVIIA of
- 7 the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.462a to 750.462j.

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) The human trafficking health advisory board is
- 2 created as an autonomous entity within the department of community
- 3 health. The board shall include all of the following members:
- 4 (a) The director of the department of human services or his or
- 5 her designated representative from within the department of human
- 6 services.
- 7 (b) The director of the department of community health or his
- 8 or her designated representative from within the department of
- 9 community health.
- 10 (c) One individual appointed by the governor from a list of 3
- 11 individuals submitted by the senate majority leader.
- 12 (d) One individual appointed by the governor from a list of 3
- 13 individuals submitted by the speaker of the house of
- 14 representatives.
- 15 (e) One individual who has experience and expertise in the
- 16 field of intervention or prevention of human trafficking or
- 17 treatment of human trafficking survivors.
- 18 (f) Two individuals who are human trafficking survivors and
- 19 who are appointed by the governor.
- 20 (2) The members first appointed to the board under subsection
- 21 (1)(c) to (f) shall be appointed within 90 days after the effective
- 22 date of this act.
- 23 (3) Of the members initially appointed under this act, 1
- 24 member shall be appointed for a term that expires on December 31,
- 25 2015, 1 member shall be appointed for a term that expires on
- 26 December 31, 2016, 1 member shall be appointed for a term that
- 27 expires on December 31, 2017, and 2 members shall be appointed for

- 1 terms that expire on December 31, 2018. At the expiration of an
- 2 initial appointment, a member shall be appointed for a term of 4
- 3 years.
- 4 (4) A member who attends less than 66 percent of the scheduled
- 5 meetings of the board in any calendar year shall be considered to
- 6 have vacated his or her appointment. Upon notification of a vacancy
- 7 under this subsection or any other vacancy, the governor shall fill
- 8 the vacancy in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 9 (5) The governor may remove a member of the board for
- 10 incompetence, dereliction of duty, malfeasance, misfeasance, or
- 11 nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 12 (6) The first meeting of the board shall be called not more
- 13 than 180 days after the effective date of this act. Before this
- 14 first meeting, the governor shall appoint the chairperson of the
- 15 board from among the members listed in subsection (1). At the first
- 16 meeting, the board shall elect from among its members a vice-
- 17 chairperson and other officers as it considers necessary or
- 18 appropriate who shall serve 1-year terms and who may be reelected.
- 19 After the first meeting, the board shall meet at least quarterly,
- 20 or more frequently at the call of the chairperson or if requested
- 21 by a majority of the members then serving.
- 22 (7) A majority of the members of the board constitute a quorum
- 23 for the transaction of business at a meeting of the board. A
- 24 majority of the members present and serving are required for the
- 25 official action of the board.
- 26 (8) The business that the board may perform shall be conducted
- 27 at a public meeting of the board held in compliance with the open

- 1 meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 2 (9) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 3 retained by the board in the performance of an official function is
- 4 subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231
- **5** to 15.246.
- 6 (10) Members of the board shall serve without compensation.
- 7 However, members of the board may be reimbursed for their actual
- 8 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 9 official duties as members of the board.
- Sec. 4. The board shall do all of the following:
- 11 (a) Collect and analyze information concerning medical and
- 12 mental health services available to survivors of human trafficking
- 13 in this state.
- 14 (b) Identify state and local agencies within this state and
- 15 other states, as well as within the federal government, that are
- 16 involved with issues relating to human trafficking, and coordinate
- 17 the dissemination of information concerning medical and mental
- 18 health services available to survivors of human trafficking in this
- 19 state.
- (c) Meet annually with local health agencies to review the
- 21 existing services available to assist survivors of human
- 22 trafficking, including crime victim assistance, health care, and
- 23 legal assistance, and establish a program to make those survivors
- 24 better aware of the services that are available to them.
- 25 (d) Establish a program to improve public awareness of medical
- 26 and mental health services available to survivors of human
- 27 trafficking in this state.

- 1 (e) Review existing state laws and administrative rules
- 2 relating to health policies affecting survivors of human
- 3 trafficking and make recommendations to the legislature and state
- 4 agencies to improve those laws and rules to address medical and
- 5 mental health services available to survivors of human trafficking
- 6 in this state.
- 7 (f) File an annual report with the chairs of the committees
- 8 concerned with health policy of the senate and the house of
- 9 representatives regarding its activities under this act. The report
- 10 shall be filed not later than February 1 of each year.
- 11 (q) File an annual report with the Michigan domestic violence
- 12 and treatment board concerning the human trafficking health
- 13 advisory board's activities under this act no later than February 1
- 14 of each year.
- 15 Sec. 5. The board shall coordinate its efforts with those of
- 16 the human trafficking commission established under section 3 of the
- 17 human trafficking commission act, 2014 PA 325, MCL 752.973.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect January 14, 2015.
