SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5157

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1246 (MCL 380.1246), as amended by 2009 PA 205.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1246. (1) A school district, public school academy, or
- 2 intermediate school district shall not continue to employ a person
- 3 AN INDIVIDUAL as a superintendent, principal, assistant principal,
- 4 or other person INDIVIDUAL whose primary responsibility is
- 5 administering instructional programs or as a chief business
- 6 official unless the person INDIVIDUAL meets 1 or more of the
- 7 following requirements, as applicable:
- 8 (a) For a superintendent, principal, assistant principal, or
- 9 other person-INDIVIDUAL whose primary responsibility is
- 10 administering instructional programs, or a chief business official,
- 11 who was employed as a school administrator in this state on or

- 1 before the effective date of the amendatory act that added this
- 2 subdivision, JANUARY 4, 2010, has completed the continuing
- 3 education requirements prescribed by rule under subsection (2) AND
- 4 MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER SUBSECTION (3).
- 5 (b) Subject to subsection (3), (5), for a superintendent,
- 6 principal, assistant principal, or other person INDIVIDUAL whose
- 7 primary responsibility is administering instructional programs and
- 8 who is initially employed as a school administrator in this state
- 9 after the effective date of the amendatory act that added this
- 10 subdivision, JANUARY 4, 2010, possesses a valid Michigan school
- 11 administrator's certificate issued under section 1536.
- 12 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall promulgate
- 13 rules establishing continuing education requirements as a condition
- 14 for continued employment for persons INDIVIDUALS described in
- 15 subsection (1)(a). The rules shall prescribe a minimum amount of
- 16 continuing education that shall be completed within 5 years after
- 17 initial employment and shall be completed each subsequent 5-year
- 18 period to meet the requirements of subsection (1)(a) for continued
- 19 employment.
- 20 (3) FOR A SUPERINTENDENT, PRINCIPAL, ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL, OR
- 21 OTHER INDIVIDUAL WHOSE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY IS ADMINISTERING
- 22 INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS, BEGINNING WITH THE FIRST SCHOOL YEAR THAT
- 23 STARTS AFTER THE DEPARTMENT FINALIZES THE GUIDELINES DESCRIBED IN
- 24 THIS SUBSECTION, IN ADDITION TO MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF RULES
- 25 PROMULGATED UNDER SUBSECTION (2), FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION TO BE
- 26 COUNTED AS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTIONS (1)(A) AND (2),
- 27 THE CONTINUING EDUCATION SHALL BE BASED ON AN INDIVIDUAL

- 1 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL AND SHALL MEET
- 2 GUIDELINES DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT. THE GUIDELINES DEVELOPED BY
- 3 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MEET AT LEAST ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 4 (A) BE BASED ON STATE BOARD-APPROVED STANDARDS FOR
- 5 PROFESSIONAL LEARNING.
- 6 (B) INCLUDE EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES IN CONDUCTING EVALUATIONS
- 7 OF TEACHERS AND OF ADMINISTRATOR PEERS. THIS SHOULD INCLUDE AT
- 8 LEAST TRAINING ON EVALUATION MODELS, PRACTICUM EXPERIENCES USING
- 9 THOSE MODELS, RATER RELIABILITY, AND PROVIDING COACHING AND
- 10 FEEDBACK TO THE TEACHER OR ADMINISTRATOR BEING EVALUATED.
- 11 (C) INCLUDE EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES IN METHODS FOR IMPROVING
- 12 TEACHER-TO-TEACHER AND TEACHER-TO-ADMINISTRATOR COLLABORATION.
- 13 (D) INCLUDE TRAINING ON INTERPRETING STUDENT ASSESSMENT DATA
- 14 AND ON HOW TO USE THAT DATA TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING.
- 15 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT THE GUIDELINES
- 16 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) NO LATER THAN 90 DAYS AFTER THE
- 17 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SUBSECTION.
- 18 (5) (3)—A school district, public school academy, or
- 19 intermediate school district may employ as a superintendent,
- 20 principal, assistant principal, or other person whose primary
- 21 responsibility is administering instructional programs a person who
- 22 is enrolled in a program leading to certification as a school
- 23 administrator under section 1536 not later than 6 months after he
- 24 or she begins the employment. A person employed as a school
- 25 administrator pursuant to this subsection has 3 years to meet the
- 26 certification requirements of section 1536, or the school district,
- 27 public school academy, or intermediate school district shall not

- 1 continue to employ the person as a school administrator described
- 2 in this subsection.
- 3 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 4 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 5 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 6 unless all of the following bills of the 98th Legislature are
- 7 enacted into law:
