SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4353

A bill to amend 1969 PA 287, entitled

"An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines and to provide remedies,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 287.331), as amended by 1997 PA 7, and by adding section 8c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Adoption" means a transfer of ownership, with or without
- 3 remuneration, of a dog, cat, or ferret AN ANIMAL from an animal
- 4 control shelter or animal protection shelter to an individual for
- 5 the purpose of being a companion animal for that individual. As
- 6 used in this subdivision, a companion animal includes but is not
- 7 limited to a dog that is used for hunting or as a guard dog.
- 8 (b) "Alteration" means a professional sterilization procedure
- 9 performed by a veterinarian that renders a dog, cat, or ferret

- 1 incapable of reproducing.
- 2 (c) "Altered", in reference to a dog, cat, or ferret, means
- 3 having undergone alteration.
- 4 (d) "Animal" means a mammal except livestock as defined in
- 5 1937 PA 284, MCL 287.121 to 287.131, and rodents.VERTEBRATE OTHER
- 6 THAN A HUMAN BEING.
- 7 (E) "ANIMAL ABUSE OFFENSE" MEANS 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING,
- 8 BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE THE LAWFUL USE OF AN ANIMAL TO HUNT OR TO
- 9 PARTICIPATE IN FIELD TRIALS OR THE LAWFUL KILLING OR OTHER USE OF
- 10 AN ANIMAL IN FARMING OR A GENERALLY ACCEPTED ANIMAL HUSBANDRY OR
- 11 FARMING PRACTICE INVOLVING LIVESTOCK:

- 17 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50A.
- 18 (iv) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 50B OF THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE,
- 19 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50B.
- 20 (v) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 50C OF THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE,
- 21 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.50C.
- 22 (vi) A VIOLATION OF SECTION 158 OF THE MICHIGAN PENAL CODE,
- 23 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.158, IF THE VIOLATION AROSE OUT OF A CRIME
- 24 AGAINST NATURE WITH AN ANIMAL.
- 25 (vii) A VIOLATION OF A LOCAL ORDINANCE SUBSTANTIALLY
- 26 CORRESPONDING TO A VIOLATION DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPHS (i) TO

- 1 (viii) AN ATTEMPT OR CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT AN OFFENSE DESCRIBED
- 2 IN SUBPARAGRAPHS (i) TO (vii).
- 3 (F) (e) "Animal control shelter" means a facility operated by
- 4 a municipality for the impoundment and care of animals that are
- 5 found in the streets or at large, animals that are otherwise held
- 6 due to the violation of a municipal ordinance or state law, or
- 7 animals that are surrendered to the animal control shelter.
- 8 (G) (f) "Animal protection shelter" means a facility operated
- 9 by a person, humane society, society for the prevention of cruelty
- 10 to animals, or any other nonprofit organization for the care of
- 11 homeless animals.
- 12 (H) (g) "Cat" means a domestic cat of any age of the species
- 13 felis FELIS catus.
- 14 (I) (h) "Department" means the state department of agriculture
- 15 AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT.
- 16 (J) (i) "Director" means the director of the department or his
- 17 or her authorized representative.
- 18 (K) (j) "Dog" means a domestic dog of any age of the species
- 19 canis CANIS familiaris.
- 20 (1) $\frac{(k)}{(k)}$ "Ferret" means an animal of any age of the species
- 21 mustela MUSTELA furo.
- 22 (M) (l)—"Health certificate" means a certificate in a form
- 23 prescribed by the department in which a veterinarian attests to the
- 24 age, sex, breed, and description of an animal, and to the fact that
- 25 at the time of preparation of the certificate, the veterinarian
- 26 examined the animal and found the animal free from visual evidence
- 27 of communicable disease.

- 3 (O) (m) "Municipality" means a county, city, village, or

- 5 (P) (n)—"Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 6 corporation, association, governmental entity, or other legal
- 7 entity.
- 8 (Q) (o) "Pet shop" means a place where animals are sold or
- 9 offered for sale, exchange, or transfer.
- 10 (R) (p) "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 11 veterinary medicine under article 15 of the public health code,
- 12 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 13 SEC. 8C. (1) AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION
- 14 SHELTER MAY CONSIDER AN INDIVIDUAL'S CRIMINAL HISTORY WHEN DECIDING
- 15 WHETHER TO ALLOW THAT INDIVIDUAL TO ADOPT AN ANIMAL. AN ANIMAL
- 16 CONTROL SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER SHALL NOT ALLOW AN
- 17 INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF AN ANIMAL ABUSE OFFENSE TO
- 18 ADOPT AN ANIMAL UNLESS A PERIOD OF AT LEAST 5 YEARS HAS ELAPSED
- 19 SINCE THE DATE OF HIS OR HER CONVICTION. AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER
- 20 OR ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER MAY CHOOSE NOT TO ALLOW AN INDIVIDUAL
- 21 WHO IS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING AN ANIMAL ABUSE OFFENSE AND ENTERS A
- 22 PLEA TO ANY OTHER CRIME IN EXCHANGE FOR DISMISSAL OF THAT CHARGE TO
- 23 ADOPT AN ANIMAL.
- 24 (2) THIS SECTION MAY BE REFERRED TO AS THE "ANIMAL ADOPTION
- 25 PROTECTION ACT".
