## SENATE BILL NO. 302

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"

(MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303) by adding section 916a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 916A. (1) THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION IS TO REGULATE
- 2 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE TRAFFIC WITHIN ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES THAT
- 3 ARE LICENSED TO SELL ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE
- 4 PREMISES TO PROMOTE THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE
- 5 CITIZENS OF THIS STATE AND TO ESTABLISH REASONABLE AND UNIFORM
- 6 REGULATIONS TO PREVENT THE DELETERIOUS SECONDARY EFFECTS OF ADULT-
- 7 ORIENTED BUSINESSES WITHIN THIS STATE. THIS SECTION IS NOT INTENDED
- 8 TO, NOR SHALL IT BE INTERPRETED TO, IMPOSE A LIMITATION OR
- 9 RESTRICTION ON THE CONTENT OF, OR REASONABLE ACCESS TO, ANY
- 10 COMMUNICATIVE MATERIALS INCLUDING ADULT-ORIENTED MATERIALS, TO

- 1 RESTRICT OR DENY ACCESS BY ADULTS TO ADULT-ORIENTED MATERIALS
- 2 PROTECTED BY AMENDMENT I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES,
- 3 TO DENY ACCESS BY THE DISTRIBUTORS AND EXHIBITORS OF ADULT-ORIENTED
- 4 ENTERTAINMENT TO THEIR INTENDED MARKET, OR TO CONDONE OR LEGITIMIZE
- 5 THE DISTRIBUTION OF OBSCENE MATERIAL.
- 6 (2) THE LEGISLATURE FINDS THAT ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES, AS A
- 7 CATEGORY OF COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES, ARE ASSOCIATED WITH A WIDE
- 8 VARIETY OF ADVERSE SECONDARY EFFECTS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO,
- 9 PERSONAL AND PROPERTY CRIMES, PROSTITUTION, POTENTIAL SPREAD OF
- 10 DISEASE, LEWDNESS, PUBLIC INDECENCY, OBSCENITY, ILLICIT DRUG USE
- 11 AND DRUG TRAFFICKING, NEGATIVE IMPACTS ON SURROUNDING PROPERTIES,
- 12 URBAN BLIGHT, LITTER, AND SEXUAL ASSAULT AND EXPLOITATION. THE
- 13 LEGISLATURE FURTHER FINDS THAT EACH OF THE FOREGOING NEGATIVE
- 14 SECONDARY EFFECTS CONSTITUTES A HARM THAT THE STATE HAS A
- 15 SUBSTANTIAL INTEREST IN PREVENTING OR ABATING, OR BOTH. THE
- 16 SUBSTANTIAL GOVERNMENT INTEREST IN PREVENTING ADVERSE SECONDARY
- 17 EFFECTS IS THE RATIONALE FOR THIS SECTION AND EXISTS INDEPENDENT OF
- 18 ANY COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS BETWEEN ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES AND NON-
- 19 ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES. THE STATE'S INTEREST IN REGULATING
- 20 ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES EXTENDS TO PREVENTING FUTURE SECONDARY
- 21 EFFECTS OF CURRENT OR FUTURE ADULT-ORIENTED BUSINESSES THAT MAY
- 22 LOCATE IN THIS STATE.
- 23 (3) AN ON-PREMISES LICENSEE SHALL NOT ALLOW IN OR ON THE
- 24 LICENSED PREMISES AN INDIVIDUAL WHO EXPOSES TO PUBLIC VIEW THE
- 25 PUBIC REGION, ANUS, OR GENITALS OR WHO DISPLAYS OTHER TYPES OF
- 26 NUDITY PROHIBITED BY LAW OR LOCAL ORDINANCE. AN ON-PREMISES
- 27 LICENSEE SHALL NOT ALLOW IN OR ON THE LICENSED PREMISES THE SHOWING

- OF FILMS, TELEVISION, SLIDES, OR OTHER ELECTRONIC REPRODUCTIONS 1
- 2 THAT DEPICT SCENES WHEREIN ANY INDIVIDUAL EXPOSES TO PUBLIC VIEW
- THE PUBIC REGION, ANUS, OR GENITALS OR DISPLAYS OTHER TYPES OF 3
- NUDITY PROHIBITED BY LAW OR LOCAL ORDINANCE. THIS PROHIBITION DOES
- NOT APPLY TO A PUBLICLY BROADCAST TELEVISION TRANSMISSION FROM A 5
- FEDERALLY LICENSED STATION.
- (4) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN EXHIBITION OR 7
- PERFORMANCE IN A THEATER, CONCERT HALL, ART CENTER, MUSEUM, OR 8
- SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS PRIMARILY DEVOTED TO THE ARTS OR 9
- THEATRICAL PERFORMANCES. 10
- 11 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 12 after the date it is enacted into law.
