SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5332

A bill to amend 1965 PA 190, entitled

"An act to provide for a system of uniformity of service for veterans,"

by amending the title and sections 1 and 2 (MCL 35.61 and 35.62), section 1 as amended by 1997 PA 131.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

- 2 An act to ESTABLISH WHO IS CONSIDERED A VETERAN IN THIS STATE; 3 AND TO provide for a system of uniformity of service for veterans.
- 4 Sec. 1. In order to provide for the uniformity of service
- 5 dates for veterans, the following dates and terms shall be
- 6 applicable to FOR PURPOSES OF all acts of the state relative to
- 7 veterans, ÷

8 (a) "Veteran" "VETERAN" means a person, who served in the

- 1 active military forces, during a period of war or who received the
- 2 armed forces expeditionary or other campaign service medal during
- 3 an emergency condition and who was discharged or released therefrom
- 4 under honorable conditions. "Veteran" also includes a person who
- 5 died in active military forces. AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SERVED IN THE
- 6 UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES, INCLUDING THE RESERVE COMPONENTS, AND
- 7 WAS DISCHARGED OR RELEASED UNDER CONDITIONS OTHER THAN
- 8 DISHONORABLE. VETERAN INCLUDES AN INDIVIDUAL WHO DIED WHILE ON
- 9 ACTIVE DUTY IN THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.
- 10 (b) "Spanish-American war" means the period beginning on April
- 11 21, 1898, and ending on July 4, 1902, includes the Philippine
- 12 insurrection and the Boxer rebellion, and in the case of a veteran
- 13 who served with the United States military forces engaged in
- 14 hostilities in the Moro province, means the period beginning on
- 15 April 21, 1898, and ending on July 15, 1903.
- 16 (c) "World War I" means the period beginning on April 6, 1917,
- 17 and ending on November 11, 1918, and in the case of a veteran who
- 18 served with the United States military forces in Russia, means the
- 19 period beginning on April 6, 1917, and ending on April 1, 1920.
- 20 (d) "World War II" means the period beginning December 7,
- 21 1941, and ending December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.
- 22 (e) "Korean conflict" means the period between June 27, 1950,
- 23 to January 31, 1955.
- 24 (f) Civil war and confederate veterans who served between
- 25 April 12, 1861, and May 26, 1865.
- 26 (g) Indian wars. Since the Indian wars were fought
- 27 intermittently over a period of years, the determination as to

- 1 whether a person shall be considered as having rendered military
- 2 service during these wars will be carefully considered by the state

- 3 veterans' trust fund. January 1, 1817, through December 31, 1898,
- 4 is considered Indian war period.
- 5 (h) Mexican wars. Since there were several skirmishes
- 6 involving the Mexican border, such as Mexican border troubles 1911-
- 7 1916; Veracruz expedition April 21, 1914, to November 26, 1914;
- 8 punitive expedition into Mexico, March 15, 1916, to February 5,
- 9 1917; therefore the persons rendering military service in any of
- 10 these skirmishes shall be considered veterans of the Mexican wars
- 11 between 1911 and February 5, 1917.
- 12 (i) Future dates. The period beginning on the date of any
- 13 future declaration of war by the congress or the beginning of an
- 14 emergency condition recognized by the issuance of a presidential
- 15 proclamation or a presidential executive order and in which the
- 16 armed forces expeditionary medal or other campaign service medals
- 17 are awarded according to presidential executive order and ending on
- 18 a date prescribed by presidential proclamation or concurrent
- 19 resolution of the congress.
- 20 (j) Veterans of the Korean conflict and veterans having served
- 21 after January 31, 1955, in an area of hazardous duty for which an
- 22 armed forces expeditionary or Vietnam service medal was received or
- 23 veterans having served in the Vietnam era, which is that period
- 24 beginning February 28, 1961, and ending on May 7, 1975.
- 25 Sec. 2. Veterans who served in more than 1 period of war
- 26 service may combine their active duty days of service to make the
- 27 90 days SATISFY THE LENGTH OF ACTIVE DUTY SERVICE required by

- 1 veteran benefit statutes or acts.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 2
- 3 after the date it is enacted into law.
