HOUSE BILL NO. 5416

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1307g.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1307G. THE STATE POLICY UNDER SECTION 1307A SHALL INCLUDE
- 2 AT LEAST ALL OF THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS CONCERNING TRAINING, WHICH
- 3 MAY INCLUDE ONLINE TRAINING THAT IS DEVELOPED OR APPROVED BY THE
- 4 DEPARTMENT:
- 5 (A) IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES, A SCHOOL
- 6 DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY
- 7 SHALL IMPLEMENT A COMPREHENSIVE TRAINING FRAMEWORK THAT INCLUDES
- 8 AWARENESS TRAINING FOR ALL SCHOOL PERSONNEL WHO HAVE REGULAR
- 9 CONTACT WITH PUPILS AND COMPREHENSIVE TRAINING FOR KEY IDENTIFIED
- 10 PERSONNEL AS DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (B).

- 1 (B) A SCHOOL DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR PUBLIC
- 2 SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL IDENTIFY SUFFICIENT KEY PERSONNEL TO ENSURE
- 3 THAT TRAINED PERSONNEL ARE GENERALLY AVAILABLE FOR AN EMERGENCY
- 4 SITUATION. BEFORE USING EMERGENCY SECLUSION OR EMERGENCY PHYSICAL
- 5 RESTRAINT WITH PUPILS, KEY IDENTIFIED PERSONNEL WHO MAY HAVE TO
- 6 RESPOND TO AN EMERGENCY SITUATION SHALL BE TRAINED IN ALL OF
- 7 SUBPARAGRAPHS (i) TO (xvi) AS FOLLOWS AND SHOULD BE TRAINED IN ALL
- 8 OF SUBPARAGRAPHS (xvii) TO (xx) AS FOLLOWS:
- 9 (i) PROACTIVE PRACTICES AND STRATEGIES THAT ENSURE THE DIGNITY
- 10 OF PUPILS.
- 11 (ii) DE-ESCALATION TECHNIQUES.
- 12 (iii) TECHNIQUES TO IDENTIFY PUPIL BEHAVIORS THAT MAY TRIGGER
- 13 EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.
- 14 (iv) RELATED SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS, INCLUDING INFORMATION
- 15 REGARDING THE INCREASED RISK OF INJURY TO PUPILS AND SCHOOL
- 16 PERSONNEL WHEN SECLUSION OR RESTRAINT IS USED.
- 17 (v) INSTRUCTION IN THE USE OF EMERGENCY SECLUSION AND
- 18 EMERGENCY PHYSICAL RESTRAINT.
- 19 (vi) IDENTIFICATION OF EVENTS AND ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS THAT
- 20 MAY TRIGGER EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.

- 22 AND RESTRAINT.
- 23 (viii) DESCRIPTION AND IDENTIFICATION OF DANGEROUS BEHAVIORS.
