SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5442

A bill to prescribe the public threat alert system as the official response to public threat situations in this state; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and authorities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "public threat alert system act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act, "public threat" means a clear,
- 4 present, persistent, ongoing, and random threat to public safety. A
- 5 public threat includes, but is not limited to, an act of terrorism,
- 6 an unresolved mass shooting, or an unresolved mass shooting spree.
- 7 Sec. 3. (1) The department of state police shall establish and
- 8 maintain the public threat alert system plan.

- 1 (2) The public threat alert system plan shall be designed to
- 2 rapidly disseminate useful information in a predetermined manner to
- 3 radio and televisions stations within this state and to send text
- 4 messages to wireless 2-way communication devices, including
- 5 cellular telephones.
- 6 (3) The public threat alert system plan shall be activated
- 7 only in accordance with the policies established by the department
- 8 of state police.
- 9 Sec. 4. (1) A person shall not intentionally make a false
- 10 report of a public threat, or intentionally cause a false report of
- 11 a public threat to be made, to a peace officer, police agency of
- 12 this state or of a local unit of government, 9-1-1 operator, or any
- 13 other governmental employee or contractor or employee of a
- 14 contractor who is authorized to receive the report, knowing that
- 15 the report is false. A person who violates this section is guilty
- 16 of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or
- a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.
- 18 (2) The court may order a person convicted under this section
- 19 to pay to the state or a local unit of government and the media the
- 20 costs of responding to the false report or threat, including, but
- 21 not limited to, the use of police or fire emergency response
- 22 vehicles and teams, under section 1f of chapter IX of the code of
- 23 criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.1f.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 25 date it is enacted into law.
- 26 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless House
- 27 Bill No. 5449 of the 98th Legislature is enacted into law.
