SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5718

A bill to amend 1979 PA 214, entitled

"An act to provide for the disposition and sale of certain stolen or abandoned property recovered or discovered within a city, village, or township; and to provide for the disposition of the proceeds of sale and certain other property,"

by amending sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 (MCL 434.181, 434.182, 434.183, and 434.184), section 1 as amended by 2006 PA 556 and sections 2, 3, and 4 as amended by 1984 PA 258.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a
- 2 law enforcement agency of a city, village, or township that
- 3 recovers stolen property or discovers abandoned personal property
- 4 within the city, village, or township, which is unclaimed for 6
- 5 months after recovery or discovery, shall report the recovery or
- 6 discovery of that property, including money, to the city or village

- 1 council or township board of trustees and shall request authority
- 2 to dispose of the property as provided in this act or to give the
- 3 property to the sheriff of the county to dispose of as provided in
- 4 1959 PA 54, MCL 434.171 to 434.174.
- 5 (2) If the property is an abandoned or stolen bicycle, the law
- 6 enforcement agency may request authority from its governing body to
- 7 donate the bicycle to a state licensed charitable organization.
- 8 (3) IF THE STOLEN PROPERTY OR ABANDONED PERSONAL PROPERTY IS
- 9 NOT A WEAPON AND IS REUSABLE PROPERTY, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
- 10 MAY REQUEST AUTHORITY FROM ITS GOVERNING BODY TO DONATE THE
- 11 PROPERTY AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 2, TO AN ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT THAT,
- 12 AT THE TIME OF THE DONATION, EXPECTS TO USE THE PROPERTY.
- 13 (4) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 14 (A) "ELIGIBLE RECIPIENT" MEANS A CITY, VILLAGE, COUNTY,
- 15 TOWNSHIP, SCHOOL DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT,
- 16 UNIVERSITY, COMMUNITY COLLEGE, PRIVATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION,
- 17 PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY, OR GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORITY, OR AN AGENCY OR
- 18 DEPARTMENT OF A CITY, VILLAGE, COUNTY, TOWNSHIP, SCHOOL DISTRICT,
- 19 INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR A PRIVATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION.
- 20 (B) "PRIVATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION" MEANS A PRIVATE
- 21 ORGANIZATION EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER SECTION 501 (C) (3) OF THE
- 22 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE, 26 USC 501(C)(3).
- 23 Sec. 2. (1) The CITY OR village council or township board of
- 24 trustees shall act upon the request of the law enforcement officer
- 25 within AGENCY UNDER SECTION 1 not less than 60 days OR MORE THAN 6
- 26 MONTHS after the receipt of the request. and not more than 6 months
- 27 after the receipt of the request.

- (2) If the CITY OR village council or township board of
 trustees authorizes the law enforcement officer AGENCY to give the
- 3 property to the sheriff of the county, the law enforcement officer
- 4 AGENCY shall deliver the property to the sheriff within 10 days.
- 5 (3) If the CITY OR village council or township board of
- 6 trustees authorizes the law enforcement officer AGENCY to dispose
- 7 of the property pursuant to THROUGH SALE UNDER this act, the law
- 8 enforcement officer AGENCY shall conduct a sale of the property in
- 9 the manner AS provided in subsection (4).
- 10 (4) The—IF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IS AUTHORIZED TO DISPOSE
- 11 OF THE PROPERTY BY SALE, THE law enforcement officer AGENCY shall
- 12 publish a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the
- 13 county not less than 5 days before the proposed sale of the
- 14 property. The notice shall MUST describe the property, including
- 15 money, and shall state the time and place of the public sale at
- 16 which the property may be purchased by the highest bidder. The law
- 17 enforcement officer AGENCY may obtain an appraisal to determine
- 18 whether money, because of age, origin, metal content, or value as a
- 19 collector's item, has a value other than its face value. Money
- 20 which THAT does not have a value other than its face value shall
- 21 MUST not be subject to the public sale provisions contained in this
- 22 section. Until the date of the sale, the property may be claimed at
- 23 the office of the law enforcement officer. AGENCY. If ownership of
- 24 the property is proved, the property shall MUST be turned over to
- 25 the owner and the sale shall OF THAT PROPERTY MUST be canceled.
- 26 insofar as the claimed property is concerned.
- 27 (5) IF THE CITY OR VILLAGE COUNCIL OR TOWNSHIP BOARD OF

- 1 TRUSTEES AUTHORIZES THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO DISPOSE OF THE
- 2 PROPERTY THROUGH DONATION, FOLLOWING A REQUEST UNDER SECTION 1(3),
- 3 THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL DONATE THE PROPERTY AS PROVIDED IN
- 4 SUBSECTION (6).
- 5 (6) IF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IS AUTHORIZED TO DISPOSE OF
- 6 THE PROPERTY BY DONATION, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL PUBLISH
- 7 A NOTICE IN A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE COUNTY NOT
- 8 LESS THAN 5 DAYS BEFORE THE PROPOSED DONATION OF THE PROPERTY. THE
- 9 NOTICE MUST DESCRIBE THE PROPERTY AND PROVIDE THE ADDRESS OF THE
- 10 OFFICE OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY AND THE DATE THE PROPERTY WILL
- 11 BE DONATED. BEFORE THE DATE PROVIDED IN THE NOTICE, THE PROPERTY
- 12 MAY BE CLAIMED AT THE OFFICE OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY. IF
- 13 OWNERSHIP OF THE PROPERTY IS PROVED, THE PROPERTY MUST BE TURNED
- 14 OVER TO THE OWNER AND THE DONATION OF THAT PROPERTY MUST BE
- 15 CANCELED.
- Sec. 3. The law enforcement officer AGENCY shall conduct the
- 17 sale of the unclaimed property and shall deposit the proceeds of
- 18 the sale, and money not subject to public sale, after deducting the
- 19 cost of the sale, including reasonable appraisal fees, with the
- 20 CITY, village, or township treasurer to the credit of the CITY,
- 21 village, or township general fund.
- 22 Sec. 4. (1) If, within 6 months after the sale UNDER SECTION
- 23 2(4), the owner of the property files with the CITY OR village
- 24 council or township board of trustees a claim for the property and
- 25 proves a right to the property, the CITY OR village council or
- 26 township board of trustees shall direct the treasurer who received
- 27 the proceeds of the sale of that property to pay the owner the

- amount of proceeds or the face value of money not subject to the 1
- 2 public sale provision contained in this act. The CITY OR village
- council or township board of trustees shall not approve any claims 3
- 4 filed more than 6 months after the sale.
- 5 (2) A law enforcement officer AGENCY disposing of property as
- provided in this act shall IS not be liable to the owner of that 6
- 7 property.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 8
- after the date it is enacted into law.
