## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## HOUSE BILL NO. 6324

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1481 (MCL 380.1481), as added by 2000 PA 230.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1481. (1) Not later than the beginning of the 2000-2001
- 2 school year, the THE Michigan virtual university VIRTUAL UNIVERSITY
- 3 shall develop, implement, and operate the MICHIGAN VIRTUAL LEARNING
- 4 RESEARCH INSTITUTE DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (7). THE MICHIGAN
- 5 VIRTUAL UNIVERSITY SHALL ALSO OPERATE THE Michigan virtual high
- 6 school, as described in this section. VIRTUAL SCHOOL AS A STATEWIDE
- 7 LABORATORY AND QUALITY MODEL OF INSTRUCTION BY IMPLEMENTING VIRTUAL
- 8 AND BLENDED LEARNING SOLUTIONS FOR SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE.
- 9 (2) The Michigan virtual high school VIRTUAL SCHOOL shall have
- the following goals:
- 11 (a) Significantly expand curricular offerings for MIDDLE

- 1 SCHOOLS AND high schools across this state through agreements with
- 2 school districts or licenses from other recognized providers.
- 3 (b) Create a statewide instructional model using interactive
- 4 multimedia tools delivered by electronic means, including, but not
- 5 limited to, the internet, digital broadcast, or satellite network,
- 6 for distributed learning at the MIDDLE SCHOOL AND high school
- 7 level.LEVELS.
- 8 (c) Provide pupils with opportunities to develop skills and
- 9 competencies through on-line ONLINE AND BLENDED learning.
- 10 (d) Offer high school teachers opportunities to learn new
- 11 skills and strategies for developing and delivering instructional
- 12 services.
- 13 (e) Accelerate this state's ability to respond to current and
- 14 emerging educational demands.
- 15 (f) Grant high school diplomas through a dual enrollment
- 16 method with school districts.
- 17 (F) (G) Act EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES TO ACT as a broker for
- 18 college level equivalent courses, as defined in section 1471, and
- 19 dual enrollment courses from postsecondary education institutions,
- 20 INCLUDING ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES.
- 21 (3) The Michigan virtual high school course offerings shall
- 22 include, VIRTUAL SCHOOL MAY OFFER VIRTUAL COURSES, INCLUDING, but
- 23 are not limited to, all of the following:
- 24 (a) Information technology courses.
- 25 (b) College level equivalent courses, as defined in section
- **26** 1471.
- (c) Courses and dual enrollment opportunities.

- 1 (d) At-risk programs and services.
- 2 (e) General education development test preparation courses for
- 3 adjudicated youth.
- 4 (f) Special interest courses.
- 5 (g) Professional development programs and services for
- 6 teachers.
- 7 (4) In addition to its other duties under this section, the
- 8 Michigan virtual university shall work with the department and
- 9 other appropriate state agencies to explore the development and
- 10 delivery of a full curriculum for migrant pupils that would be
- 11 available through distance learning. The Michigan virtual
- 12 university and the department shall submit a joint report on their
- 13 findings under this subsection to the legislature not later than 1
- 14 year after the effective date of this section.
- 15 (5) Nonpublic school students and home-schooled children may
- 16 participate in course offerings of the Michigan virtual high school
- 17 to the same extent they are allowed to participate in school
- 18 district course offerings under this act and the state school aid
- 19 act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1601 to 388.1772.
- 20 (4) A HOME-SCHOOLED CHILD OR A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENT WHO IS
- 21 A RESIDENT OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT SUBSCRIBES TO SERVICES
- 22 PROVIDED BY THE MICHIGAN VIRTUAL SCHOOL MAY USE THE SERVICES
- 23 PROVIDED BY THE MICHIGAN VIRTUAL SCHOOL TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND
- 24 SHALL NOT BE CHARGED A RATE THAT EXCEEDS THE RATE THAT IS CHARGED
- 25 TO A PUPIL ENROLLED IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT WHO USES THE SAME
- 26 SERVICES.
- 27 (5) THE MICHIGAN VIRTUAL SCHOOL SHALL MAINTAIN AN

- 1 ACCREDITATION FROM A RECOGNIZED NATIONAL OR INTERNATIONAL
- 2 ACCREDITATION ENTITY.
- 3 (6) The Michigan virtual university VIRTUAL UNIVERSITY shall
- 4 fund the Michigan virtual high school VIRTUAL SCHOOL from
- 5 appropriations made for this purpose and may also use funds
- 6 received from other sources. The department shall provide technical
- 7 assistance as requested by the Michigan virtual university VIRTUAL
- 8 UNIVERSITY for the purposes of this section.
- 9 (7) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE MICHIGAN
- 10 VIRTUAL LEARNING RESEARCH INSTITUTE SUPPORT AND ACCELERATE
- 11 INNOVATION IN EDUCATION AND PROVIDE LEADERSHIP FOR THIS STATE'S
- 12 SYSTEM OF VIRTUAL LEARNING EDUCATION.
- 13 (8) FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUPPORTING AND ACCELERATING INNOVATION
- 14 IN EDUCATION AND PROVIDING LEADERSHIP FOR THIS STATE'S SYSTEM OF
- 15 VIRTUAL LEARNING EDUCATION UNDER SUBSECTION (7), THE MICHIGAN
- 16 VIRTUAL LEARNING RESEARCH INSTITUTE SHALL DO AT LEAST ALL OF THE
- 17 FOLLOWING:
- 18 (A) TEST, EVALUATE, AND RECOMMEND NEW TECHNOLOGY-BASED
- 19 INSTRUCTIONAL TOOLS AND RESOURCES, AS APPROPRIATE.
- 20 (B) RESEARCH, DESIGN, AND RECOMMEND VIRTUAL EDUCATION DELIVERY
- 21 MODELS.
- 22 (C) RESEARCH, DEVELOP, AND RECOMMEND CRITERIA BY WHICH CYBER
- 23 SCHOOLS AND VIRTUAL COURSE PROVIDERS SHOULD BE MONITORED AND
- 24 EVALUATED.
- 25 (D) ANALYZE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF VIRTUAL LEARNING DELIVERY
- 26 MODELS IN PREPARING PUPILS TO BE COLLEGE- AND CAREER-READY.
- 27 (E) PROVIDE AN EXTENSIVE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM TO

- EDUCATION PERSONNEL THAT FOCUSES ON THE EFFECTIVE INTEGRATION OF 1
- 2 VIRTUAL LEARNING INTO CURRICULA AND INSTRUCTION.
- (F) IDENTIFY BARRIERS TO THE ADOPTION OF VIRTUAL LEARNING IN 3
- THE PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEM.
- 5 (G) IDENTIFY OTHER OPPORTUNITIES TO ENCOURAGE VIRTUAL LEARNING
- IN THE PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEM.
- (H) IDENTIFY AND SHARE BEST PRACTICES FOR PLANNING, 7
- IMPLEMENTING, AND EVALUATING VIRTUAL AND BLENDED EDUCATION DELIVERY 8
- MODELS TO ACCELERATE THE ADOPTION OF INNOVATIVE EDUCATION DELIVERY 9
- 10 MODELS STATEWIDE.
- 11 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 12 after the date it is enacted into law.
