

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 5408**

A bill to amend 1951 PA 51, entitled

"An act to provide for the classification of all public roads, streets, and highways in this state, and for the revision of that classification and for additions to and deletions from each classification; to set up and establish the Michigan transportation fund; to provide for the deposits in the Michigan transportation fund of specific taxes on motor vehicles and motor vehicle fuels; to provide for the allocation of funds from the Michigan transportation fund and the use and administration of the fund for transportation purposes; to promote safe and efficient travel for motor vehicle drivers, bicyclists, pedestrians, and other legal users of roads, streets, and highways; to set up and establish the truck safety fund; to provide for the allocation of funds from the truck safety fund and administration of the fund for truck safety purposes; to set up and establish the Michigan truck safety commission; to establish certain standards for road contracts for certain businesses; to provide for the continuing review of transportation needs within the state; to authorize the state transportation commission, counties, cities, and villages to borrow money, issue bonds, and make pledges of funds for transportation purposes; to authorize counties to advance funds for the payment of deficiencies necessary for the payment of bonds issued under this act; to provide for the limitations, payment, retirement, and security of the bonds and pledges; to provide for appropriations and tax levies by counties and townships for county roads; to authorize contributions by townships for county roads; to provide for the establishment and administration of the state trunk line fund, local bridge fund, comprehensive transportation fund, and

certain other funds; to provide for the deposits in the state trunk line fund, critical bridge fund, comprehensive transportation fund, and certain other funds of money raised by specific taxes and fees; to provide for definitions of public transportation functions and criteria; to define the purposes for which Michigan transportation funds may be allocated; to provide for Michigan transportation fund grants; to provide for review and approval of transportation programs; to provide for submission of annual legislative requests and reports; to provide for the establishment and functions of certain advisory entities; to provide for conditions for grants; to provide for the issuance of bonds and notes for transportation purposes; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies and officials; to provide for the making of loans for transportation purposes by the state transportation department and for the receipt and repayment by local units and agencies of those loans from certain specified sources; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 9a (MCL 247.659a), as amended by 2012 PA 298.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 9a. (1) As used in this section:

2 (a) "Asset management" means an ongoing process of
3 maintaining, **PRESERVING**, upgrading, and operating physical assets
4 cost-effectively, based on a continuous physical inventory and
5 condition assessment **AND INVESTMENT TO ACHIEVE ESTABLISHED**
6 **PERFORMANCE GOALS.**

7 (b) **"ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN" MEANS A PLAN CREATED BY THE**
8 **DEPARTMENT AND APPROVED BY THE STATE TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION OR A**
9 **PLAN CREATED BY A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY AND APPROVED BY THE LOCAL ROAD**
10 **AGENCY'S GOVERNING BODY THAT INCLUDES PROVISIONS FOR ASSET**
11 **INVENTORY, PERFORMANCE GOALS, RISK OF FAILURE ANALYSIS, ANTICIPATED**
12 **REVENUES AND EXPENSES, PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES, AND COORDINATION WITH**
13 **OTHER INFRASTRUCTURE OWNERS.**

14 (c) ~~(b)~~ "Bridge" means a structure including supports erected
15 over a depression or an obstruction, such as water, a highway, or a
16 railway, for the purposes of carrying traffic or other moving

1 loads, and having an opening measuring along the center of the
2 roadway of more than 20 feet between undercopings of abutments or
3 spring lines of arches, or extreme ends of openings for multiple
4 boxes where the clear distance between openings is less than 1/2 of
5 the smaller contiguous opening.

6 (D) ~~(e)~~—"Central storage data agency" means ~~that~~ **AN** agency or
7 office chosen by the council where the data collected is stored and
8 maintained.

9 ~~—— (d) "Council" means the transportation asset management~~
10 ~~council created by this section.~~

11 (e) "Department" means the state transportation department.

12 (f) "Federal-aid eligible" means a public road or bridge that
13 is eligible for federal aid to be spent for the construction,
14 repair, or maintenance of that road or bridge.

15 (g) "Local road agency" means a county road commission or
16 designated county road agency or city or village that is
17 responsible for the construction or maintenance of public roads
18 within the state under this act.

19 (H) **"MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL" MEANS THE MICHIGAN**
20 **INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 3 OF THE MICHIGAN**
21 **INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL ACT.**

22 (I) ~~(h)~~—"Multiyear program" means a compilation of road and
23 bridge projects anticipated to be contracted for by the department
24 or a local road agency during a 3-year period. The multiyear
25 program shall include a listing of each project to be funded in
26 whole or in part with state or federal funds.

27 (J) **"REGION" MEANS THE GEOGRAPHIC JURISDICTION OF ANY OF THE**

19 (I) "WATER ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL" MEANS THE WATER ASSET
20 MANAGEMENT COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 5002 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES
21 AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.5002.

22 (2) In order to provide a coordinated, unified effort by the
23 various ~~roadway~~ ROAD agencies within ~~the~~ THIS state, the
24 transportation asset management council is hereby created within
25 the state transportation commission. ~~and is charged with advising~~
26 UPON CREATION OF THE MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL, THE
27 TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL BE PLACED WITHIN THE

1 **MICHIGAN INFRASTRUCTURE COUNCIL.**

13 (4) The **TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT** council shall consist
 14 of 10 voting members appointed by the state transportation
 15 commission. The **TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT** council shall
 16 include 2 members from the ~~county road association~~ **COUNTY ROAD**
 17 **ASSOCIATION** of Michigan, 2 members from the Michigan ~~municipal~~
 18 ~~league,~~ **MUNICIPAL LEAGUE**, 2 members from the state planning and
 19 development regions, 1 member from the Michigan ~~townships~~
 20 ~~association,~~ **TOWNSHIPS ASSOCIATION**, 1 member from the Michigan

 24 Each agency with voting rights shall submit a list of 2 nominees to

 7 central data storage agency shall be nonvoting and shall be for as
 8 long as the agency continues to serve as the data storage
 9 repository. The member from the Michigan ~~association~~ **ASSOCIATION** of
 10 ~~counties~~ **COUNTIES** shall be initially appointed for 2 years. The
 11 member from the Michigan ~~townships association~~ **TOWNSHIPS**
 12 **ASSOCIATION** shall be initially appointed for 3 years. Of the
 13 members first appointed from the ~~county road association~~ **COUNTY**
 14 **ROAD ASSOCIATION** of Michigan, the Michigan ~~municipal league,~~
 15 **MUNICIPAL LEAGUE**, and the state planning and development regions, 1
 16 member of each group shall be appointed for 2 years and 1 member of
 17 each group shall be appointed for 3 years. At the end of the
 18 initial appointment, all terms shall be for 3 years. The
 19 chairperson shall be selected from among the voting members of the

21 ~~construction associations and related transportation road~~

1 (7) THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL MAY APPOINT AN
2 ADVISORY COMMITTEE WHOSE MEMBERS SHALL SERVE AS NEEDED TO PROVIDE
3 RESEARCH ON ISSUES AND PROJECTS AS DETERMINED BY THE TRANSPORTATION
4 ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL. AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBER WHO IS NOT A
5 MEMBER OF THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL DOES NOT HAVE
6 VOTING RIGHTS ON THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE. A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE
7 ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IS ADVISORY ONLY
8 AND IS NOT BINDING.

9 (8) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, COSTS
10 INCURRED FOR DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS, OR SUBMITTAL, OTHER THAN
11 COSTS COVERED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE FEDERAL-AID ELIGIBLE HIGHWAY
12 SYSTEM, ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE OWNER OF THE DATA. A LOCAL
13 ROAD AGENCY MAY REQUEST PLANNING REGION ASSISTANCE OR REIMBURSEMENT
14 FOR DATA COLLECTED ON NON-FEDERAL-AID ELIGIBLE ROADS OR STREETS
15 WITHIN THAT REGION. THE REGION SHALL DETERMINE WHERE TO COLLECT
16 LOCAL ROAD OR STREET DATA TO EXPEND ITS REMAINING DATA COLLECTION
17 MONEY BASED UPON REQUESTS RECEIVED FROM LOCAL ROAD AGENCIES.

18 (9) THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL PROMOTE
19 AND OVERSEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE REGIONAL
20 INFRASTRUCTURE ASSET MANAGEMENT PILOT PROGRAM ON A STATEWIDE LEVEL
21 AS THE PROGRAM RELATES TO ROADS, BRIDGES, AND RELATED
22 TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE.

23 (10) NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2019, THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET
24 MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL DEVELOP A TEMPLATE FOR AN ASSET MANAGEMENT
25 PLAN FOR USE BY LOCAL ROAD AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE FOR 100 OR MORE
26 CERTIFIED MILES OF ROAD AND REQUIRE ITS SUBMISSION TO THE
27 TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION

1 (12). NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2019, THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET
2 MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL ESTABLISH A SCHEDULE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF
3 ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANS BY LOCAL ROAD AGENCIES DESCRIBED IN
4 SUBSECTION (11)(B) THAT ENSURES THAT 1/3 OF THOSE LOCAL ROAD
5 AGENCIES SUBMIT AN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN EACH YEAR. THE TEMPLATE
6 REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO,
7 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

8 (A) ASSET INVENTORY, INCLUDING THE LOCATION, MATERIAL, SIZE,
9 AND CONDITION OF THE ASSETS, IN A FORMAT THAT ALLOWS FOR AND
10 ENCOURAGES DIGITAL MAPPING. ALL STANDARDS AND PROTOCOLS FOR ASSETS
11 SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTING STANDARDS. STANDARDS
12 AND PROTOCOLS FOR ASSETS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE FOR FEDERAL AID SHALL BE
13 CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS.

14 (B) PERFORMANCE GOALS, INCLUDING THE DESIRED CONDITION AND
15 PERFORMANCE OF THE ASSETS, WHICH SHALL BE SET BY THE LOCAL ROAD
16 AGENCY. PERFORMANCE GOALS MAY VARY AMONG ASSET CLASSES UNDER THE
17 LOCAL ROAD AGENCY'S JURISDICTION. IF A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY HAS
18 JURISDICTION OVER ROADS OR BRIDGES THAT ARE DESIGNATED AS PART OF
19 THE FEDERAL NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM, PERFORMANCE GOALS FOR THAT
20 PORTION OF THE SYSTEM SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH ESTABLISHED FEDERAL
21 PERFORMANCE TARGETS.

22 (C) RISK OF FAILURE ANALYSIS, INCLUDING THE IDENTIFICATION OF
23 THE PROBABILITY AND CRITICALITY OF A FAILURE OF THE MOST CRITICAL
24 ASSETS AND ANY CONTINGENCY PLANS.

25 (D) ANTICIPATED REVENUES AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING A DESCRIPTION
26 OF ALL REVENUE SOURCES AND ANTICIPATED RECEIPTS FOR THE PERIOD
27 COVERED BY THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN AND EXPECTED INFRASTRUCTURE

1 REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT EXPENDITURES, INCLUDING PLANNED IMPROVEMENTS
2 AND CAPITAL RECONSTRUCTION.

3 (E) PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES, INCLUDING A DETERMINATION OF HOW THE
4 LOCAL ROAD AGENCY'S INVESTMENT STRATEGY WILL ACHIEVE THE DESIRED
5 LEVELS OF SERVICE AND PERFORMANCE GOALS AND THE STEPS NECESSARY TO
6 ENSURE ASSET CONDITIONS MEET OR ACHIEVE STATED GOALS AND A
7 DESCRIPTION AND EXPLANATION OF ANY GAP BETWEEN ACHIEVABLE CONDITION
8 AND PERFORMANCE THROUGH THE INVESTMENT STRATEGY AND DESIRED GOALS.

9 (F) A DESCRIPTION OF ANY PLANS OF THE ASSET OWNER TO
10 COORDINATE WITH OTHER ENTITIES, INCLUDING NEIGHBORING JURISDICTIONS
11 AND UTILITIES, TO MINIMIZE DUPLICATION OF EFFORT REGARDING
12 INFRASTRUCTURE PRESERVATION AND MAINTENANCE.

13 (G) PROOF OF ACCEPTANCE, CERTIFICATION, OR ADOPTION BY THE
14 LOCAL ROAD AGENCY'S GOVERNING BODY.

15 (11) ~~(7)~~—The department, each county road commission, and each
16 city and village of this state shall annually submit a report ON
17 INFRASTRUCTURE CONDITIONS AND INVESTMENT to the transportation
18 asset management council. This report shall include a multiyear
19 program developed through the asset management process described in
20 this section. NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 1, 2019, THE TRANSPORTATION
21 ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL ESTABLISH A SCHEDULE FOR THE
22 SUBMISSION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE REPORT REQUIRED BY THIS
23 SUBSECTION. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO A MULTIYEAR PROGRAM
24 REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION:

25 (A) Projects contained in the department's annual multiyear
26 program shall be consistent with the department's asset management
27 process and ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN, AND shall be reported consistent

1 with categories established by the transportation asset management
2 council.

3 (B) Projects contained in the annual multiyear program of each
4 local road agency **RESPONSIBLE FOR 100 OR MORE CERTIFIED MILES OF**
5 **ROAD** shall be consistent with the asset management process **AND**
6 **ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN** of each ~~each~~ **THAT** local road agency and shall be
7 reported consistent with categories established by the
8 transportation asset management council.

9 (C) **PROJECTS CONTAINED IN THE ANNUAL MULTIYEAR PROGRAM OF EACH**
10 **LOCAL ROAD AGENCY RESPONSIBLE FOR LESS THAN 100 CERTIFIED MILES OF**
11 **ROAD SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROCESS OF THAT**
12 **LOCAL ROAD AGENCY AND SHALL BE REPORTED CONSISTENT WITH CATEGORIES**
13 **ESTABLISHED BY THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL.**

14 (12) BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2020, EACH LOCAL ROAD AGENCY
15 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (11)(B) SHALL BEGIN SUBMITTING AN ASSET
16 MANAGEMENT PLAN TO THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL
17 ACCORDING TO THE 3-YEAR SCHEDULE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (10). THE
18 ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN SHALL COVER A PERIOD OF AT LEAST 3 YEARS, AND
19 SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH A TEMPLATE PROVIDED BY THE TRANSPORTATION
20 ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL. A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY THAT IS REQUIRED TO
21 SUBMIT AN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN UNDER THIS SUBSECTION THAT HAS NOT
22 SUBMITTED THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN BY OCTOBER 1, 2024 IS NOT IN
23 COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION. A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY THAT IS NOT IN
24 COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE NOTIFIED BY THE
25 TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL THAT THE LOCAL ROAD AGENCY
26 SHALL COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION WITHIN 120 DAYS OF THE NOTICE. IF
27 A LOCAL ROAD AGENCY FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION AFTER 120

1 DAYS OF THE NOTICE REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION, THE TRANSPORTATION
2 ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE
3 NONCOMPLIANCE AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY WITHHOLD FUNDS DISTRIBUTED TO
4 THE LOCAL ROAD AGENCY UNDER THIS ACT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL RELEASE
5 ANY FUNDS WITHHELD FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION TO THE
6 LOCAL ROAD AGENCY IN THE FOLLOWING MONTH'S ALLOCATION AFTER
7 COMPLIANCE IS VERIFIED.

8 (13) THE TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT COUNCIL SHALL REVIEW
9 AN ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN SUBMITTED UNDER SUBSECTION (12) NO LATER
10 THAN 6 MONTHS AFTER RECEIPT OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN. THE
