



# SENATE BILL No. 1163

November 8, 2018, Introduced by Senator HUNE and referred to the Committee on  
Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled  
"Michigan liquor control code of 1998,"  
by amending section 517 (MCL 436.1517), as amended by 2004 PA 169.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1       Sec. 517. (1) The commission may issue international sporting  
2 event licenses for the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on  
3 the premises in connection with an international golf tournament  
4 conducted during calendar year 2004 if all of the following  
5 circumstances are found by the commission to exist:

6       (a) The local governmental unit in which the international  
7 sporting event is to be conducted is the host governmental unit for  
8 that event.

9       (b) The premises to be licensed are located in a theme area or  
10 theme areas designated by the governing body of the host

1 governmental unit in connection with the international sporting  
2 event or are operated in conjunction with that event.

3 (c) The commission determines that the international sporting  
4 event will attract a substantial number of tourists from outside  
5 this state.

6 (d) The international sporting event is conducted under the  
7 auspices of a national or international sanctioning body.

8 (e) The applicant is any of the following:

9 (i) A Michigan licensee for the sale of alcoholic liquor for  
10 consumption on the premises.

11 (ii) The promoter of the international sporting event or an  
12 affiliate of the promoter.

13 (iii) A person who has entered into a written concession or  
14 catering agreement with the promoter of the international sporting  
15 event or its affiliate, which agreement has been approved by the  
16 commission.

17 (iv) An organization qualified for licensure as a special  
18 licensee under section ~~111(10)~~ **111(13)** and the rules of the  
19 commission.

20 (2) Licenses issued under this section ~~shall~~ **MUST** be for a  
21 period of not more than 30 consecutive days and are not  
22 transferable as to ownership or location. The license ~~shall~~ **MUST** be  
23 for specific designated time periods that include the international  
24 sporting event and activities associated with the event.

25 (3) Not more than 40 licenses shall be issued under this  
26 section for use at the same time in a theme area or theme areas.

27 (4) The governing body of a host governmental unit described

1 in subsection (1) shall supply to the commission for the  
2 commission's review a list containing the names of applicants and  
3 the locations of the premises to be licensed under this section.  
4 The governing body of the host governmental unit shall recommend  
5 the number of licenses to be issued pursuant to this section in the  
6 theme area or theme areas. The commission shall not issue any  
7 licenses pursuant to this section that are not recommended by the  
8 governing body of the host governmental unit.

9 (5) The governing body of the host governmental unit shall  
10 provide, in conjunction with the list described in subsection (4),  
11 written certification to the commission that all premises to be  
12 licensed under this section comply with applicable state and local  
13 building, safety, and health laws, rules, and regulations.

14 (6) A license issued pursuant to this section is not subject  
15 to section 503.

16 (7) An applicant for a license under this section shall pay to  
17 the commission a license fee of \$1,000.00 at the time of  
18 application.

19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect  
20 unless Senate Bill No. 1166

21 of the 99th Legislature is enacted into law.
