SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4016

A bill to amend 1986 PA 268, entitled "Legislative council act,"

by amending section 104a (MCL 4.1104a), as amended by 2013 PA 241.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 104a. (1) The council shall appoint a council
- 2 administrator who shall be the chief executive officer of all
- 3 legislative council agencies. The council administrator is an at-
- 4 will employee and shall serve at the pleasure of the council. The
- 5 council administrator has all the following duties and
- 6 responsibilities:
- 7 (a) To provide general supervisory oversight over all
- 8 legislative council agencies.
- **9** (b) To provide personnel policy oversight and development for





- 1 all legislative council agencies.
- 2 (c) To develop, prepare, and present legislative council3 agency budgets.
- 4 (d) To review quarterly financial statements of legislative5 council agencies and monitor budgetary compliance.
- 6 (e) To act as secretary to the council, including but not7 limited to the following:
- 8 (i) Scheduling of meetings for the council and subcommittees.
- 9 (ii) Keeping and recording of minutes and records of meetings.
- 10 (f) To perform other duties and responsibilities as determined
 11 and assigned by the council.
- 12 (g) To receive and decide appeals of public record requests, 13 as provided in the legislative open records act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 14 15.251 to 15.259f.
- (2) In addition to the responsibilities provided in subsection
 (1), at the direction of the Michigan state capitol commission, the
 council administrator shall do both of the following:
- 18 (a) Administer compensation, benefits, and other personnel19 support for the employees of the Michigan state capitol commission.
- 20 (b) Administer computer, telephone, and technical support for21 employees of the Michigan state capitol commission.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect January 1, 2020.
- Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect unless House Bill No. 4011 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into law.
