A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

1 their bridge cards at many farmer's markets in this state. The
 2 department shall also notify recipients about the double up food
 3 bucks program that is administered by the fair food network.
 4 Recipients shall receive information about the double up food bucks
 5 program, including information that when the recipient spends
 6 \$20.00 at participating farmer's markets through the program, the
 7 recipient can receive an additional \$20.00 to buy Michigan produce.
 8 The department shall ensure access to the double up food bucks
 9 program in each of the state's counties.

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11 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

12 Sec. 401. The funds appropriated in part 1 for census-related
 13 services shall be distributed to an organization that received the
 14 largest share of funding from the census-related services
 15 appropriation in article X of 2018 PA 207 to support census
 16 outreach and preparation for citizen participation in the upcoming
 17 2020 federal census. The purpose of the funding is to prepare for
 18 the census to ensure an accurate citizen count. The funding will be
 19 used to support staffing related to census outreach, and
 20 implementation of outreach strategies, including, but not limited
 21 to, training for local officials, support of local complete count
 22 committees, public outreach and communications campaigns, and
 23 coordination with the Michigan nonprofit complete count committee.

25 **DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS**

26 Sec. 431. The funds appropriated to the department of
 27 licensing and regulatory affairs in part 1 for implementation of
 28 the Michigan regulation and taxation of marihuana act, 2018 IL 1,
 29 MCL 333.27951 to 333.27967, shall be expended by the department in



1 coordination with other state agencies for implementation costs as
2 specified in that act. The department of licensing and regulatory
3 affairs shall provide a report to the chairs of the senate and
4 house appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal
5 agencies, and the state budget office no later than August 1, 2019
6 detailing implementation costs by agency. Consistent with the
7 provisions of the Michigan regulation and taxation of marihuana
8 act, 2018 IL 1, MCL 333.27951 to 333.27967, the general
9 fund/general purpose revenue shall be repaid from proceeds
10 collected under that act.
11

12 **DEPARTMENT OF TALENT AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

13 Sec. 501. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
14 Michigan enhancement grants, \$500,000.00 shall be awarded to a
15 nonprofit organization that has been established for at least 10
16 years, that is exempt from federal income taxation under section
17 501(c)(6) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, and
18 that promotes the aerospace manufacturing industry in this state to
19 develop a maintenance, repair, and overhaul facility at an airport
20 located in a county with a population greater than 1,500,000 and in
21 a charter township with a population between 28,500 and 30,000 and
22 located in a county with a population between 340,000 and 345,000
23 and in a charter township with a population between 53,000 and
24 55,000, according to the most recent federal decennial census.

25 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
26 enhancement grants, \$2,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a nonprofit
27 organization that has been established for at least 10 years, that
28 is exempt from federal income taxation under section 501(c)(6) of
29 the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, that promotes the



1 aerospace manufacturing industry in this state to develop a low-
2 orbit launch site within this state.

3 (3) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
4 enhancement grants, \$200,000.00 shall be awarded for a bridge
5 project located in a county with a population between 161,000 and
6 170,000 and in a township with a population between 3,300 and 3,500
7 according to the most recent federal decennial census.

8 (4) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
9 enhancement grants, \$300,000.00 shall be awarded to a fire
10 department located in a county with a population over 1,500,000 and
11 in a city with a population between 40,000 and 60,000 according to
12 the most recent federal decennial census.

13 (5) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
14 enhancement grants, \$5,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a county with
15 a population between 80,000 and 85,000 according to the most recent
16 federal decennial census for dam improvements on 1 or more dams, if
17 the dam meets all of the following criteria:

18 (a) The dam is located either in a county with a population
19 between 80,000 and 85,000 or in a county with a population between
20 25,000 and 25,800 according to the most recent federal decennial
21 census.

22 (b) The dam is regulating or maintaining a lake level that is
23 established under part 307 of the natural resources and
24 environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.30701 to
25 324.30723.

26 (6) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for Michigan
27 enhancement grants, \$3,000,000.00 shall be awarded to a city with a
28 population between 10,000 and 20,000 in a county with a population
29 between 170,000 and 180,000 according to the most recent federal



1 decennial census for street and pedestrian infrastructure upgrades.

2 Sec. 502. (1) From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
3 Michigan enhancement grants, the department shall execute a grant
4 form with each recipient, pursuant to subsection (2). All grant
5 funds are considered to be direct appropriations and, subject to
6 receipt of all information under subsections (2) and (3), shall be
7 fully dispersed by the department to each recipient by May 30,
8 2019.

9 (2) The department shall develop a grant form for each
10 recipient to complete in order to receive funding from part 1. The
11 form shall include the following:

12 (a) All necessary identifying information for the recipient,
13 including any necessary tax identification information.

14 (b) A description of the project for which the grant funds
15 will be expended, including tentative timeline and estimated
16 budget.

17 (c) A requirement for quarterly reports from the recipient to
18 the department that provide an accounting of all funds received by
19 the recipient and status of the project.

20 (d) A claw-back provision that allows this state to recoup or
21 otherwise collect any funds that are unspent or otherwise misused.

22 (3) The grantee shall respond to all reasonable information
23 requests from the department related to grant expenditures and
24 retain grant records for a period of not less than 3 years, and the
25 grant may be subject to audit as determined by the department. The
26 grant form required under subsection (2) shall include signed
27 assurance by the chief executive officer or other executive officer
28 of the grant recipient that this requirement will be met.

29 (4) All funds awarded shall be expended by the recipient, and



1 projects completed, by January 31, 2021. If at that time, as
2 evidenced by the quarterly reports, any unexpended funds remain,
3 those funds shall be returned by the grantee to the state treasury.
4 The state budget director may, on a case by case basis, extend this
5 deadline, upon request by a grant recipient.

6 (5) The department shall provide quarterly updates on the
7 accounting and status of each project to the senate and house
8 appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
9 and the state budget office.

12 Enacting section 1. Section 304 of 2018 PA 618 is repealed.
