## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 6298

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 312f (MCL 257.312f), as amended by 2020 PA 241.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 312f. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 2 an individual shall be not less than 18 years of age before he or
- 3 she is issued a vehicle group designation or indorsement, other
- 4 than a motorcycle indorsement, or not less than 21 years of age and
- 5 has been approved by the Transportation Security Administration for
- 6 a hazardous material endorsement before he or she is issued a
- 7 hazardous material indorsement endorsement on an operator's or
- 8 chauffeur's license and, as provided in this section, the
- 9 individual shall pass a knowledge test and a driving skills tests





- 1 test that comply with minimum federal standards prescribed in 49
- 2 CFR part 383. The knowledge test and the driving skills test scores
- 3 must be retained by the secretary of state as provided under 49 CFR
- 4 383.135. An individual who is 18 years of age or older operating a
- 5 vehicle to be used for farming purposes only may obtain an A or B
- 6 vehicle group designation or an F vehicle indorsement. Each written
- 7 examination given to an applicant for a vehicle group designation
- 8 or indorsement must include subjects designed to cover the type or
- 9 general class of vehicle to be operated. Except as follows, an
- 10 individual shall pass an examination that includes a driving skills
- 11 test designed to test competency of the applicant for an original
- 12 vehicle group designation and passenger indorsement on an
- 13 operator's or chauffeur's license to drive that type or general
- 14 class of vehicle upon the highways of this state with safety to
- 15 persons and property:
- 16 (a) The secretary of state shall waive the driving skills test
- 17 for an individual operating a vehicle that is used under the
- 18 conditions described in section 312e(8)(a) to (d) unless the
- 19 vehicle has a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,001 pounds or more
- 20 on the power unit and is to be used to carry hazardous materials on
- 21 which a placard is required under 49 CFR parts 100 to 199.
- 22 (b) The driving skills test may be waived if the applicant has
- 23 a valid license with the appropriate vehicle group designation,
- 24 passenger vehicle indorsement, or school bus indorsement in another
- 25 state issued in compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317, or if the
- 26 individual successfully passes a driving skills test administered
- 27 in another state that meets the requirements of federal law and the
- 28 law of this state.
- 29 (c) The secretary of state may waive the knowledge test and

- 1 the driving skills test required under this section for an
- 2 individual with military commercial motor vehicle experience if the
- 3 individual, at the time of application, certifies and provides
- 4 evidence satisfactory to the secretary of state that he or she
- 5 continuously met all of the requirements under 49 CFR part 383
- 6 during the 2-year period immediately preceding the date of
- 7 application for the commercial driver license.
- 8 (2) Except for an individual who has held an operator's or
- 9 chauffeur's license for less than 1 year, the secretary of state
- 10 shall waive the knowledge test and the driving skills test and
- 11 issue a 1-year seasonal restricted vehicle group designation to an
- 12 otherwise qualified applicant to operate a group B or a group C
- 13 vehicle for a farm related service industry if all of the following
- 14 conditions are met:
- 15 (a) The applicant meets the requirements of 49 CFR 383.77.
- 16 (b) The seasons for which the seasonal restricted vehicle
- 17 group designation is issued are from April 2 to June 30 and from
- 18 September 2 to November 30 only of a 12-month period or, at the
- 19 option of the applicant, for not more than 180 days from the date
- 20 of issuance in a 12-month period.
- 21 (c) The commercial motor vehicle for which the seasonal
- 22 restricted vehicle group designation is issued must be operated
- 23 only if all the following conditions are met:
- 24 (i) The commercial motor vehicle is operated only on routes
- 25 within 150 miles from the place of business to the farm or farms
- 26 being served.
- 27 (ii) The commercial motor vehicle does not transport a quantity
- 28 of hazardous materials on which a placard under 49 CFR parts 100 to
- 29 199 is required except for the following:

- 1 (A) Diesel motor fuel in quantities of 1,000 gallons or less.
- 2 (B) Liquid fertilizers in quantities of 3,000 gallons or less.
- 3 (C) Solid fertilizers that are not transported with any4 organic substance.
- 5 (iii) The commercial motor vehicle does not require the H, N, P,6 S, T, or X vehicle indorsement.
- 7 (3) A seasonal restricted vehicle group designation under this 8 section must be issued, suspended, revoked, canceled, denied, or 9 renewed in accordance with this act. The secretary of state may 10 renew a seasonal restricted vehicle group designation 1 time per 11 calendar year regardless of whether the seasonal restricted vehicle 12 group designation is expired at the time of renewal.
- 13 (4) The secretary of state may enter into an agreement with 14 another public or private corporation or agency to conduct a 15 driving skills test required under this section, section 312e, or 49 CFR part 383. Before the secretary of state authorizes an 16 17 individual to administer a corporation's or agency's driver skills 18 testing operations or authorizes an examiner to conduct a driving 19 skills test, that individual or examiner must complete both a state 20 and Federal Bureau of Investigation fingerprint-based criminal 21 history check through the department of state police.
  - (5) The secretary of state shall not issue a commercial learner's permit, a vehicle group designation, or a vehicle indorsement to an applicant for an original vehicle group designation or vehicle indorsement under section 312e or may cancel a commercial learner's permit or all vehicle group designations or endorsements on an individual's operator's or chauffeur's license to whom 1 or more of the following apply:
    - (a) The applicant has had his or her license suspended or

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- 1 revoked for a reason other than as provided in section 321a, 515,
- 2 732a, or 801c or section 30 of the support and parenting time
- 3 enforcement act, 1982 PA 295, MCL 552.630, in the 36 months
- 4 immediately preceding application. However, a vehicle group
- 5 designation may be issued if the suspension or revocation was due
- 6 to a temporary medical condition or failure to appear at a
- 7 reexamination as provided in section 320.
- 8 (b) The applicant was convicted of or incurred a bond
- 9 forfeiture in relation to a 6-point violation as provided in
- 10 section 320a in the 24 months immediately preceding application if
- 11 the violation occurred while the applicant was operating a
- 12 commercial motor vehicle, or a violation of section 625(3) or
- 13 former section 625b, or a local ordinance that substantially
- 14 corresponds to section 625(3) or former section 625b in the 24
- 15 months immediately preceding application, if the applicant was
- 16 operating any type of motor vehicle.
- 17 (c) The applicant is listed on the national driver register,
- 18 the commercial driver's license information system, National Driver
- 19 Register, the Commercial Driver's License Information System,
- 20 beginning January 6, 2023, the National Drug and Alcohol
- 21 Clearinghouse, or the driving records of the state in which the
- 22 applicant was previously licensed as being disqualified from
- 23 operating a commercial motor vehicle or as having a license or
- 24 driving privilege suspended, revoked, canceled, or denied.
- 25 (d) The applicant is listed on the national driver register,
- 26 the commercial driver's license information system, National Driver
- 27 Register, the Commercial Driver's License Information System, or
- 28 the driving records of the state in which the applicant was
- 29 previously licensed as having had a license suspended, revoked, or

- 1 canceled in the 36 months immediately preceding application if a
- 2 suspension or revocation would have been imposed under this act had
- 3 the applicant been licensed in this state in the original instance.
- 4 This subdivision does not apply to a suspension or revocation that
- 5 would have been imposed due to a temporary medical condition or
- 6 under section 321a, 515, 732a, or 801c or section 30 of the support
- 7 and parenting time enforcement act, 1982 PA 295, MCL 552.630.
- **8** (e) The applicant is subject to a suspension or revocation
- 9 under section 319b or would have been subject to a suspension or
- 10 revocation under section 319b if the applicant had been issued a
- 11 vehicle group designation or vehicle indorsement.
- 12 (f) The applicant has been disqualified from operating a
- 13 commercial motor vehicle under 49 USC 31301 to 31317 or the
- 14 applicant's license to operate a commercial motor vehicle has been
- 15 suspended, revoked, denied, or canceled within 36 months
- 16 immediately preceding the date of application.
- 17 (q) The United States Secretary of Transportation has
- 18 disqualified the applicant from operating a commercial motor
- 19 vehicle.
- 20 (h) The applicant fails to satisfy the federal regulations
- 21 promulgated under 49 CFR parts 383 and 391 by refusing to certify
- 22 the type of commercial motor vehicle operation the applicant
- 23 intends to perform and fails to present valid medical certification
- 24 to the secretary of state if required to do so. The requirement of
- 25 this subdivision is waived from July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020
- 26 pursuant to the Waiver in Response to the COVID-19 National
- 27 Emergency For States, CDL Holders, CLP Holders, and Interstate
- 28 Drivers Operating Commercial Motor Vehicles.
- 29 (i) The applicant has been disqualified from operating a

- 1 commercial motor vehicle due to improper or fraudulent testing.
- 2 (j) If the secretary of state determines through a
- 3 governmental investigation that there is reason to believe that a
- 4 commercial driver license or endorsement was issued as a result of
- 5 fraudulent or improper conduct in taking a knowledge test or a
- 6 driving skills test required under 49 CFR part 383, the secretary
- 7 of state shall require the applicant to retake and successfully
- 8 pass that test. The secretary of state shall cancel any commercial
- 9 driver license or endorsement issued as a result of the suspect
- 10 test unless the applicant retakes and passes that test.
- 11 (6) The secretary of state shall not renew or upgrade a12 vehicle group designation if 1 or more of the following conditions
- **13** exist:
- 14 (a) The United States Secretary of Transportation has
- 15 disqualified the applicant from operating a commercial motor
- 16 vehicle.
- 17 (b) The applicant is listed on the national driver register or
- 18 the commercial driver's license information system National Driver
- 19 Register, the Commercial Driver's License Information System, or
- 20 beginning on January 6, 2023, the National Drug and Alcohol
- 21 Clearinghouse as being disqualified from operating a commercial
- 22 motor vehicle or as having a driver license or driving privilege
- 23 suspended, revoked, canceled, or denied.
- 24 (c) On or after January 30, 2012, the applicant fails to meet
- 25 the requirements of 49 CFR parts 383 and 391 by refusing to certify
- 26 the type of commercial motor vehicle operation the applicant
- 27 intends to perform and fails to present medical certification to
- 28 the secretary of state if required to do so. The requirement of
- 29 this subdivision is waived from July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020,

- 1 pursuant to the Waiver in Response to the COVID-19 National
- 2 Emergency For States, CDL Holders, CLP Holders, and Interstate
- 3 Drivers Operating Commercial Motor Vehicles.
- 4 (7) The secretary of state shall only consider bond
- 5 forfeitures under subsection (5)(b) for violations that occurred on
- 6 or after January 1, 1990 when determining the applicability of
- 7 subsection (5).
- 8 (8) If an applicant for an original vehicle group designation
- 9 was previously licensed in another jurisdiction, the secretary of
- 10 state shall request a copy of the applicant's driving record from
- 11 that jurisdiction. If 1 or more of the conditions described in
- 12 subsection (5) exist in that jurisdiction when the secretary of
- 13 state receives the copy, the secretary of state shall cancel all
- 14 vehicle group designations on the individual's operator's or
- 15 chauffeur's license.
- 16 (9) The secretary of state shall cancel all vehicle group
- 17 designations on an individual's operator's or chauffeur's license
- 18 upon receiving notice from the United States Secretary of
- 19 Transportation, the national driver register, the commercial
- 20 driver's license information system, National Driver Register, the
- 21 Commercial Driver's License Information System, or another state or
- 22 jurisdiction that 1 or more of the conditions described in
- 23 subsection (5) existed at the time of the individual's application
- 24 in this state.
- 25 (10) The secretary of state shall cancel all vehicle group
- 26 designations on the individual's operator's or chauffeur's license
- 27 upon receiving proper notice that the individual no longer meets
- 28 the federal driver qualification requirements under 49 CFR parts
- 29 383 and 391 to operate a commercial motor vehicle in interstate or

- 1 intrastate commerce, or the individual no longer meets the driver
- 2 qualification requirements to operate a commercial motor vehicle in
- 3 intrastate commerce under the motor carrier safety act of 1963,
- 4 1963 PA 181, MCL 480.11 to 480.25.
- 5 (11) Subsection (5)(a), (b), (d), and (f) does not apply to an
- 6 applicant for an original vehicle group designation who at the time
- 7 of application has a valid license to operate a commercial motor
- 8 vehicle issued by any state in compliance with 49 USC 31301 to
- **9** 31317.
- 10 (12) As used in this section, "farm related service industry"
- 11 means custom harvesters, farm retail outlets and suppliers, agri-
- 12 chemical business, or livestock feeders.
