SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 1094

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 21717 (MCL 333.21717), as amended by 2014 PA 66, and by adding section 5145.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5145. (1) The department, in consultation with the department of licensing and regulatory affairs, shall do all of the following:
- 4 (a) By November 1, 2020, conduct an evaluation of the
- 5 operation, efficacy, clinical outcomes, and performance of each
- 6 COVID-19 regional hub that was implemented and operating during
- 7 this state's response to coronavirus in nursing homes and provide a
- 8 detailed report on its evaluation to the house and senate standing

- 1 committees on health policy.
- 2 (b) By November 1, 2020, develop and submit a plan to the
- 3 house and senate standing committees on health policy that is based
- 4 on relevant guidance issued by the federal Centers for Disease
- 5 Control and Prevention and incorporates recommendations from the
- 6 Michigan nursing homes COVID-19 preparedness task force. The plan
- 7 shall describe a process by which the department is able to
- 8 implement dedicated facilities available for use for only
- 9 coronavirus-positive patients in each of the 8 health care regions
- 10 of this state to provide care to individuals who test positive for
- 11 coronavirus and are ineligible for admission at a hospital, nursing
- 12 home, or adult foster care facility. The plan shall also describe
- 13 how health care systems and hospitals with excess surge capacity
- 14 can be utilized for the placement of individuals who test positive
- 15 for coronavirus and are ineligible for admission at a hospital,
- 16 nursing home, or adult foster care facility, prior to the
- 17 individuals being transferred to a dedicated facility described in
- 18 this subdivision. The department shall consider and address within
- 19 the plan any relevant operational or procedural challenges
- 20 identified by the Michigan nursing homes COVID-19 preparedness task
- 21 force, including, but not limited to, the transfer of nursing home
- 22 residents, testing and laboratory priority for nursing home
- 23 residents and staff, and quality of life considerations. If the
- 24 plan uses the regional hub design described in subdivision (a), the
- 25 plan must incorporate any enhancement that the department considers
- 26 appropriate to prevent the spread of coronavirus in nursing homes
- 27 based on the evaluation conducted by the department under this
- 28 section.
- 29 (c) By November 1, 2020, and each month thereafter, provide a

- 1 report to the house and senate standing committees on health policy
- 2 that includes, but is not limited to, all of the following
- 3 information for each nursing home:
- 4 (i) The new number of COVID-19 positive cases among nursing
- 5 home residents and staff for the reporting period.
- 6 (ii) The new number of COVID-19 positive cases among nursing
- 7 home residents and staff that are symptomatic versus asymptomatic
- 8 for the reporting period.
- 9 (iii) The new number of COVID-19 deaths among nursing home
- 10 residents and staff for the reporting period.
- 11 (iv) The new number of COVID-19 recoveries among nursing home
- 12 residents and staff for the reporting period.
- 13 (v) The new number of COVID-19 tests conducted on nursing home
- 14 residents and staff for the reporting period.
- 15 (vi) The new number of nursing home residents who were
- 16 transferred out of the facility and into a hospital, care and
- 17 recovery center, or other facility for the reporting period.
- 18 (vii) The cumulative number of COVID-19 positive cases among
- 19 nursing home residents and staff, to date.
- 20 (viii) The cumulative number of COVID-19 deaths among nursing
- 21 home residents and staff that are symptomatic versus asymptomatic,
- 22 to date.
- 23 (ix) The cumulative number of COVID-19 deaths among nursing
- 24 home residents and staff, to date.
- 25 (x) The cumulative number of COVID-19 recoveries among nursing
- 26 home residents and staff, to date.
- 27 (xi) The cumulative number of COVID-19 tests conducted on
- 28 nursing home residents and staff, to date.

- 1 (xii) The cumulative number of nursing home residents who were 2 transferred to a hospital, COVID-19 regional hub, care and recovery 3 center, or other facility, to date.
- 4 (xiii) An inventory of current stock of medical supplies and 5 personal protective equipment.
- 6 (xiv) Current version of any visitation policy issued by the 7 department affecting nursing homes.
- 8 (2) The plan required under subsection (1)(b) shall also
 9 provide for both of the following regarding an individual who tests
 10 positive for coronavirus and needs to be transferred to a dedicated
 11 facility or other location described in subsection (1)(b):
- 12 (a) That a physician shall provide, in writing and in a time 13 frame and manner determined by the department, that the individual 14 is medically stable for the transfer.
- 15 (b) Twenty-four hour notice to the individual, the 16 individual's family members, or the individual's legal 17 representative regarding the transfer.
- 18 (3) As used in this section:
- 19 (a) "Coronavirus" means severe acute respiratory syndrome 20 coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2).
- 21 (b) "Health care region" means a health care region as 22 described by the department.
- Sec. 21717. (1) An individual shall not be admitted or retained for care in a nursing home who—if any of the following apply:
- (a) The individual requires special medical or surgical
 treatment, or treatment for acute mental illness, developmental
 disability, communicable tuberculosis, or a communicable disease,
 unless the home is able to provide an area and a program for the

- 1 care. The department shall approve both the area and the program.
- 2 (b) The individual has tested positive for coronavirus, is
- 3 currently receiving treatment at a hospital, and has less than 72
- 4 hours remaining in the individual's overall isolation period as
- 5 described in guidelines established by the federal Centers for
- 6 Disease Control and Prevention.
- 7 (c) Beginning November 1, 2020, the individual has tested
- 8 positive for coronavirus unless either of the following applies:
- 9 (i) The individual has since recovered from coronavirus.
- 10 (ii) The nursing home elects to establish and subsequently
- 11 demonstrates to the department that it is able to provide a
- 12 designated area within its facility for individuals who test
- 13 positive for coronavirus and has a program for retaining and
- 14 providing the appropriate level of care necessary for individuals
- 15 who test positive for coronavirus. To be considered for approval by
- 16 the department, the nursing home's designated area must meet proper
- 17 infection control safeguards and the program must be consistent
- 18 with adequate supply, testing, dedicated staffing, and operational
- 19 capacity of the nursing home at the time of an individual's
- 20 diagnosis. The nursing home shall not admit or retain an individual
- 21 in its care under this subparagraph unless the department approves
- 22 the nursing home's designated area and program described in this
- 23 subparagraph. A nursing home with a designated area approved by the
- 24 department must continuously evaluate and ensure the nursing home's
- 25 ability to meet each standard established by the department at the
- 26 time of the initial approval.
- 27 (2) As used in this section, "coronavirus" means severe acute
- 28 respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2).
