SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4839

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 2020 PA 302.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 759. (1) Subject to this subsection and section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before a primary or a special primary, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of a primary or a special primary, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township or city in which the elector is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election. primary or special primary. Except as otherwise

provided in section 761(2), the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election. primary or special primary. An application received before a primary or special primary may be for either that primary or special primary only, or for that primary or special primary and 7 the election or special election that immediately follows. The clerk of a city or township may provide an annual absent voter ballot application to an elector that allows an elector to select 9 10 any or all of the elections to be held in the calendar year. An 11 annual absent voter ballot application that allows an elector to select any or all of the elections to be held in the calendar year 12 must not be sent out or made available to an elector more than 75 13 14 days before the first regular election date each year as provided 15 in section 641. If the secretary of state provides an absent voter 16 ballot application that contains more election options than an 17 absent voter ballot application provided by a city or township, and 18 the absent voter ballot application otherwise complies with the requirements of this section, the clerk of the city or township 19 20 shall honor the election options requested by an elector who uses the absent voter ballot application provided by the secretary of 21 state. An individual may submit a voter registration application 22 23 and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in 24 25 which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are 26 27 approved by the clerk or deputy clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an 28 29 absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1) and subject to this subsection and section 761(3), at any time during the 75 days before an election or special election, but not later than 8 p.m. on the day of an election or special election, an elector may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the clerk of the township - or city - or village in which the voter is registered. The clerk of a city or township shall not send by first-class mail an absent voter ballot to an elector after 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the election or special election. Except as otherwise provided in section 761(2), the clerk of a city or township shall not issue an absent voter ballot to a registered elector in that city or township after 4 p.m. on the day before the election or special election. The clerk of a city or township may provide an annual absent voter ballot application to an elector that allows an elector to select any or all of the elections to be held in the calendar year. An annual absent voter ballot application that allows an elector to select any or all of the elections to be held in the calendar year must not be sent out or made available to an elector more than 75 days before the first regular election date each year as provided in section 641. If the secretary of state provides an absent voter ballot application that contains more election options than an absent voter ballot application provided by a city or township, and the absent voter ballot application otherwise complies with the requirements of this section, the clerk of the city or township shall honor the election options requested by an elector who uses the absent voter ballot application provided by the secretary of state. An individual may submit a voter registration application and an absent voter ballot application at the same time if applying

in person with the clerk or deputy clerk of the city or township in which the individual resides. Immediately after his or her voter registration application and absent voter ballot application are approved by the clerk, the individual may, subject to the identification requirement in section 761(6), complete an absent voter ballot at the clerk's office.

- (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this section may be made in any of the following ways:
 - (a) By a written request signed by the voter.
- (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the clerk of the city or township.
- (c) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for that purpose by the secretary of state.
 - (d) (c)—On a federal postcard application.
- (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the application. Subject to section 761(2), a clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A person An individual shall not be in possession of a signed absent voter ballot application except for the applicant; a member of the applicant's immediate family; a person an individual residing in the applicant's household; a person an individual whose job normally includes the handling of mail, but only during the course of his or her employment; a registered elector requested by the applicant to return the application; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or other authorized election official. A registered elector who is requested by the applicant to return his or her absent voter ballot application shall sign the certificate on the absent voter ballot application.

(6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent voter ballot must be included with each application furnished an applicant:

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and date the application in the place designated. Your signature must appear on the application or you may not receive an absent voter ballot.

- Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:
- (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service, or common carrier.
- (b) Deliver the application personally to the clerk's office, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
- (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law,

- sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or grandchild or a person an individual residing in the voter's household may mail or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
 - (d) If an applicant cannot return the application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select any registered elector to return the application. The person individual returning the application must sign and return the certificate at the bottom of the application.
- (7) A person An individual who prints and distributes absent voter ballot applications shall print on the application the warning, certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
- (8) A person An individual who makes a false statement in an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person An individual who forges a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a felony. A person An individual who is not authorized in this act and who both distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (9) The absent voter ballot application of an elector who is a program participant, as that term is defined in **section 3 of** the address confidentiality program act, **2020 PA 301, MCL 780.853**, is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
