SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 416

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 16186 (MCL 333.16186), as amended by 2020 PA 329.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 16186. (1) An individual who is licensed to practice a 1 2 health profession in another state or in a province of Canada, who is registered in another state, or who holds a health profession 3 4 specialty field license or specialty certification from another state and who applies for licensure, registration, specialty 5 6 certification, or a health profession specialty field license in this state may be granted an appropriate license or registration or 7 specialty certification or health profession specialty field 8





- 1 license upon satisfying the board or task force to which the
 2 applicant applies as to all of the following:
- 3 (a) The applicant substantially meets the requirements of this
 4 article and rules promulgated under this article for licensure,
 5 registration, specialty certification, or a health profession
 6 specialty field license.
- 7 (b) Subject to subsection (3), the applicant is licensed,
 8 registered, specialty certified, or specialty licensed in another
 9 state or is licensed in a province in Canada that maintains
 10 standards substantially equivalent to those of this state.
 - (c) Subject to subsection (3), if the applicant is licensed to practice a health profession in a province in Canada, the applicant completed the educational requirements in Canada or in the United States for licensure in Canada or in the United States.
 - (d) If the applicant is licensed to practice a health profession in a province in Canada, that the applicant will perform the professional services for which he or she bills in this state, and that any resulting request for third-party reimbursement will originate from the applicant's place of employment in this state.
 - (2) Before granting a license, registration, specialty certification, or a health profession specialty field license to the applicant, the board or task force to which the applicant applies may require the applicant to appear personally before it for an interview to evaluate the applicant's relevant qualifications.
 - (3) An applicant who is licensed in a province in Canada who meets the requirements of subsection (1)(c) and takes and passes who has taken and passed a national examination in this country that is approved by the appropriate licensing board of this state,

- 1 or subject to subsection (5) who takes and passes has taken and
- 2 passed a Canadian national examination approved by the appropriate
- 3 licensing board of this state, is considered to have met the
- 4 requirements of subsection (1)(b). This subsection does not apply
- 5 if the department, in consultation with the appropriate licensing
- 6 board, promulgates a rule disallowing the use of this subsection
- 7 for an applicant licensed in a province in Canada who does not
- 8 substantially meet the training or educational requirements
- 9 expected of an applicant for the same health profession who
- 10 received his or her education in the United States or who is not
- 11 licensed in a province in Canada that maintains standards
- 12 substantially equivalent to those of this state.
- 13 (4) If the department receives an application for licensure
- 14 under part 187 from an individual who is licensed as a respiratory
- 15 therapist in Canada, the department shall consult the international
- 16 reciprocity agreement executed by the National Board for
- 17 Respiratory Care and the Canadian Society of Respiratory Therapists
- **18** in effect on July 1, 2004.
- 19 (5) Until the appropriate licensing board promulgates rules to
- 20 implement this section, an applicant described in subsection (3)
- 21 who has taken and passed the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying
- 22 Examination Parts I and II is considered to have taken and passed a
- 23 Canadian national examination approved by the appropriate licensing
- 24 board under subsection (3).
