SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 843

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled "The state school aid act of 1979,"

 - (g) Campus security policies and crime statistics pursuant to the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law 101-542, 104 Stat 2381. Information shall must include all material prepared pursuant to the public information reporting requirements under the crime awareness and campus security act of 1990, title II of the student right-to-know and campus security act, Public Law
