SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4833

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 6230, 6233, 6234, 6235, 6236, and 6251 (MCL 333.6230, 333.6233, 333.6234, 333.6235, 333.6236, and 333.6251), sections 6230 and 6234 as added and sections 6233, 6235, 6236, and 6251 as amended by 2012 PA 501.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 6230. As used in this part:
- 2 (a) "Department" means the department of licensing and3 regulatory affairs.
 - (b) "Director" means the director of the department or his or her the director's designee.
- 6 (c) "Substance use disorder prevention services" means that

- 11 Sec. 6233. (1) A—Except as provided under subsection (4), a
- 12 person not otherwise licensed to provide psychological, medical, or

- 15 that is a substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation
- 16 service unless it is licensed under this part.

Sec. 6234. The department may promulgate rules under the administrative procedures act of 1969 for the administration of this part and the licensing of substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation services programs—under this part. Rules promulgated under former section 6231 relating to the licensing of substance use disorder services programs remain effective and applicable on and after the effective date of this section—January 1, 2013, until rules are first promulgated by the department under this section.

Sec. 6235. (1) An application for a license shall must be in a form prescribed by the department and shall—authorize the director to obtain from any source information as to the ability of the applicant to comply with this part and rules promulgated under this part.

(2) An applicant for an initial license shall must include evidence of notice to churches, schools, and incorporated nonprofit civic organizations in the applicant's service delivery area of its intent to provide substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation services.

Sec. 6236. The department shall provide an opportunity for individuals in the applicant's service delivery area to comment before the issuance of a license to the applicant. The department shall make the decision to issue or deny a license based on the applicant's ability to comply with the requirements of this part and rules promulgated under this part. If the administrative decision is the denial of a license, the department shall describe

the reasons for the denial in writing to the applicant at the time the decision is rendered.

Sec. 6251. Notwithstanding the existence of any other remedy, the department may maintain an action in the name of this state for an injunction or other process against a person to restrain or prevent the establishment, conduct, management, or operation of a substance use disorder services program offering substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation services without a license or where if operation of the licensee's program is likely to result in serious harm to recipients of the substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation services.
