SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5829

A bill to amend 1964 PA 208, entitled

"An act to grant scholarships to students enrolled in postsecondary education institutions; and to provide for the administration of the scholarship program,"

by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 5a, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 (MCL 390.972, 390.973, 390.974, 390.975, 390.975a, 390.976, 390.977, 390.978, 390.979, and 390.980), sections 3 and 4 as amended by 2021 PA 40, section 5 as amended by 1986 PA 270, sections 6, 8, and 9 as amended by 1980 PA 500, and section 7 as amended by 2004 PA 181.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2. (1) The administration of this scholarship program
shall rest with the higher education assistance authority created

3 by Act No. 77 of the Public Acts of 1960, being sections 390.951 to

 2 the scholarship program created in section 1.
- 3 (2) As used in this act, "department" means the department of 4 lifelong education, advancement, and potential.
- 5 Sec. 3. (1) Subject to subsection (4), the authority 6 department shall conduct a competitive examination among eligible 7 applicants for state competitive scholarships at times and places 8 as determined by the authority. department. The authority 9 department may designate a competitive examination to be 10 administered among eligible applicants for state competitive 11 scholarships. The authority department shall annually establish the 12 examination scores necessary to qualify for the competitive scholarship according to the funding available to meet the award 13
 - (2) The authority department may also use scholastic achievement in determining award winners and shall issue appropriate certificates of recognition to individuals awarded scholarships. The authority department shall grant annual renewal of scholarships.

- (3) The authority department shall promulgate rules to implement this act pursuant to under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, including rules for the conduct of examinations for the award of scholarships, for the procedures for the awarding of annual renewal scholarships, and for the purpose of defining eligible postsecondary institutions under this act.
- (4) Notwithstanding any provision of this act or rule to the

- (a) For an applicant enrolled in an eligible postsecondary
 institution during the 2020 spring term and the 2020-2021 academic
 year, 11 years after his or her the applicant's eligibility is
 determined.
 - (b) For any other applicant, 10 years after his or her the applicant's eligibility is determined.
 - (3) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, students enrolling in postsecondary educational institutions for the first time after the fiscal year ending on September 30, 2023, and students who have not already received state competitive scholarships before the fiscal year ending on September 30, 2023, are not eligible to receive state competitive scholarships under this act.
 - Sec. 5. (1) There shall must be awarded for each academic year the number of first-year scholarships that may be financed through available money. Of this number not less than 3 scholarships shall may be awarded to residents of each legislative district, and the balance of the scholarships shall must be awarded to residents of the state at large.
 - (2) Each scholarship described in subsection (1) shall must be renewed by the authority department upon application of the student awarded the first-year scholarship without further examination if the applicant remains eligible under sections 4 and 6 and is in compliance with rules promulgated by the authority.department.
 - (3) A scholarship may be renewed for not more than 10 semesters or its equivalent in trimesters or quarters of undergraduate education, or the equivalent as determined by the

1 authority department for less than full-time but more than half-2 time students.

- (4) Beginning after October 1, 1988, a scholarship may be awarded for not more than 6 semesters or its equivalent in trimesters, quarters, or terms of graduate education, or the equivalent as determined by the authority department for less than full-time but more than half-time students. Money shall may not be appropriated for purposes of this subsection for any fiscal year unless the amount appropriated under this act for that fiscal year for state competitive scholarships for undergraduate education equals or exceeds the amount appropriated for the state competitive scholarship program for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1987.
- (5) A residual scholarship shall must be awarded to a qualifying applicant who does not receive an initial scholarship award, but who may be eligible for an award later in the year or during an academic year when initial recipients relinquish their scholarship awards.

Sec. 5a. The authority department may award honorary scholarship certificates to those applicants who would otherwise be eligible for a scholarship under this act but because of the lack of financial need are not eligible for a monetary scholarship. The names of the recipients of such awards shall must be published the same as the names of the winners of monetary scholarships.

Sec. 6. Each first-year scholarship is for a period of 1 academic year and the scholarship award shall—for state competitive scholarships awarded prior to the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023 must not exceed the amount of tuition and fees for the full academic year as reported by the approved eligible postsecondary institution in which the applicant is enrolled, or an amount as the

authority department finds appropriate in relation to the 1 2 applicant's own financial resources other than wages that may be due the applicant for part-time work performed by the applicant 3 during the academic year, whichever is the lesser. For the purposes 4 5 of determining the dollar amount of the scholarship for students 6 awarded state competitive scholarships prior to the academic year 7 2024-2025, the financial resources of the applicant shall—include 8 the cash or equivalent resources of the applicant's parents 9 available for the postsecondary education of the applicant, and 10 allowance shall be made for other members of the applicant's family 11 enrolled in an approved eligible postsecondary institution, of postsecondary education, pursuant to under rules adopted by the 12 authority. department. Notwithstanding any other provision of this 13 14 act, a student who has not received a state competitive scholarship 15 prior to the academic year 2024-2025 must be considered to lack financial need. If the amount of appropriated funds is insufficient 16 to provide each student with the scholarship amount for which the 17 18 student is eligible, the authority department shall establish a 19 maximum scholarship level for that academic year. Renewal 20 scholarships shall must not be less than the initial first-year 21 scholarship awards unless predicated by changes in student or 22 family financial resources. 23 Sec. 7. (1) An applicant awarded a first-year scholarship or a 24 renewal scholarship is not restricted in the choice of the 25 institution in this state which he or she that the applicant 26 desires to attend if the institution is an eligible postsecondary 27 institution under rules promulgated by the Michigan higher 28 education assistance authority, department, except that a student 29 shall not use a scholarship award at an institution whose primary

- 1 purpose is to prepare students for ordination or appointment as a
- 2 member of the clergy of a church, denomination, or religious
- 3 association, order, or sect. An applicant awarded a first-year
- 4 scholarship or a renewal scholarship is not restricted in the
- 5 choice of the course of study he or she the applicant wishes to

- 7 (2) An approved eligible postsecondary institution chosen by
- 8 the applicant is not required to accept the applicant for
- 9 enrollment, or once having admitted the applicant, to continue the
- 10 applicant's enrollment. The approved eligible postsecondary
- 11 institution accepting the enrollment of a state competitive
- 12 scholarship award winner shall notify the authority department of
- 13 the recipient's enrollment and shall submit annually to the
- 14 authority department reports which that are required and necessary
- 15 to administer this act.
- Sec. 8. State competitive scholarships shall must be awarded
- 17 by the authority department on the basis of merit and financial
- 18 need and without regard to race, sex, religion, color, or national
- 19 origin.
- 20 Sec. 9. The authority department shall promulgate rules
- 21 prescribing the reports to be made by the applicants awarded state
- 22 competitive scholarships or annual renewal scholarships and the
- 23 eligible postsecondary institutions enrolling the applicants.
- 24 Before payment of a state competitive scholarship or annual renewal
- 25 scholarship is made to the applicant, the applicant shall certify
- 26 in writing the name of the approved eligible postsecondary
- 27 institution in which the applicant is enrolled and the applicant's
- 28 intention to use the scholarship to pay for the tuition and fees to
- 29 the approved eligible postsecondary institution. Prorated payments

shall must be made at the beginning of each semester or term to the
student or to the eligible postsecondary institution for credit to
the student's account.

Sec. 10. The authority department may accept gifts, grants,
bequests, donations, and devises, from whatever sources, of real,
personal, or mixed property and moneys for the purposes described
in this act. The authority department shall prepare an annual
report of all gifts, grants, bequests, donations, and devises for

the governor and the legislature.
