

**SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 4415**

A bill to amend 1909 PA 283, entitled

"An act to revise, consolidate, and add to the laws relating to the establishment, opening, discontinuing, vacating, closing, altering, improvement, maintenance, and use of the public highways and private roads; the condemnation of property and gravel therefor; the building, repairing and preservation of bridges; maintaining public access to waterways under certain conditions; setting and protecting shade trees, drainage, and cutting weeds and brush within this state; providing for the election or appointment and defining the powers, duties, and compensation of state, county, township, and district highway officials; and to prescribe penalties and provide remedies,"

by amending section 10 (MCL 224.10), as amended by 2020 PA 286.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 10. (1) The clerk and the members of a board of county
2 road commissioners are subject to 1968 PA 317, MCL 15.321 to

2 (2) The board of county road commissioners shall employ a
3 competent county highway engineer who shall make surveys ordered by
4 the board, prepare plans and specifications for roads, bridges, and
5 culverts, and exercise general supervision over construction to
6 insure that the plans and specifications are strictly followed. Two
7 or more adjoining counties may employ the same engineer, if the
8 work in 1 or more of the counties is not enough to employ the whole
9 time of the engineer. The engineer employed by the board ~~shall be~~
10 **is** known as the county highway engineer.

11 (3) The board may also engage other professional and
12 consultant services as it considers necessary to implement this act
13 and promote efficiency and economy in the operation of the county
14 road system. The board may also employ other necessary laborers and
15 may purchase machines, tools, appliances, and materials that ~~it-the~~
16 **board** considers necessary or convenient for the performance of work
17 by the laborers. ~~In-Subject to subsection (4), in~~ cases involving
18 the expenditure of an amount greater than ~~\$15,000.00-\$75,000.00~~ for
19 the purchase of machines, tools, appliances, and materials, the
20 board of county road commissioners shall advertise for sealed
21 proposals for the machines, tools, appliances, and materials
22 proposed to be purchased, except under emergency conditions, in
23 which case the limit must not exceed ~~\$50,000.00-\$250,000.00~~. All
24 purchases made under this section must be compiled separately for
25 purposes of board approval. The board shall advertise for sealed
26 proposals for the purchase of passenger vehicles and trucks
27 weighing less than ~~5,000-10,000~~ pounds. The board may purchase
28 surplus properties from the state and federal governments without
29 advertising for sealed proposals.



1 (4) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, and each
2 subsequent fiscal year, the state treasurer shall adjust the dollar
3 amounts under subsection (3) by the percentage increase in the
4 Detroit Consumer Price Index for the preceding calendar year and
5 round to the nearest \$100.00 increment. As used in this subsection,
6 "Detroit Consumer Price Index" means the most comprehensive index
7 of consumer prices available for the Detroit-Warren-Dearborn area
8 from the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department
9 of Labor.

10 (5) ~~(4)~~—Each county road commission shall take all reasonable
11 steps to ensure minority business enterprises have the equal
12 opportunity to compete and perform contracts or purchases of
13 services, or both, for the county road commission. The county road
14 commission shall issue a plan for implementing this subsection.

15 (6) ~~(5)~~—A county road commission may enter into a contract or
16 agreement for the purchase of real or personal property for public
17 purposes, to be paid for in installments over a period not to
18 exceed 30 years or the useful life of the property acquired,
19 whichever is less. Real or personal property purchased under this
20 act may serve as collateral in support of the purchase, contract,
21 or agreement.
