SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 836 as introduced 4-28-88:

The bill would amend the Michigan Youth Corps Act to require the Department of Social Services, as part of its summer youth employment and training programs, to employ youth corps participants to maintain and repair State early education and development academies (which would be created under Senate Bill 831), upon application to the youth corps by academy directors. The bill also would lower the minimum age for youth corps participation from 18 to 17.

The bill is tie-barred to Senate Bill 831.
