SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 1006 as introduced 9-22-88:

The bill would amend the Occupational Code to provide that a person would be subject to the penalty provisions of the Code if the person did not comply with requirements in the Public Health Code on the handling, containment, decontamination, transportation, and disposal of infectious waste, as proposed in Senate Bill 1005, in the same manner in which health facilities or agencies would be required to comply with these proposed provisions. The bill is tie-barred to Senate Bill 1005.
