ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 5445

AN ACT to make appropriations for the department of military affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1989; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain duties of the department of military affairs; to provide grants to certain counties; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of military affairs, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1989, from the funds identified as follows:

Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in this act is \$12,637,500.00 and state spending to be paid to units of local government is as follows:

Department of Military Affairs

Payments in lieu of taxes	\$ 50,000
Grants to counties	200,000
Total	\$ 250,000

- (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each department that state spending to local units of government will be less than the amount that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the principal executive officer shall immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the department of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.
- Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

Sec. 203. As used in this act:

- (a) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- (b) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- Sec. 204. The department of military affairs is authorized to utilize a portion of the \$79,400.00 appropriated in section 101 for disbursing officers to provide incentive payments to national guard recruiters as long as this expenditure does not require a supplemental appropriation or transfer of appropriations to this account.
- Sec. 205. From the \$3,523,200.00 appropriated in section 101 to the headquarters and garrisons unit for contractual services, supplies, and materials and rental and facility development, money is provided to test all new employee applicants for controlled substances. An applicant whose test results are positive shall not be considered for employment for at least 12 months after the date of the positive test result.
- Sec. 206. The department of military affairs shall cooperate with each community to make the garrison training centers available for rental activities within the local community where reasonable. The department may charge a rental fee of not more than the total cost of renting the garrison training center including overtime compensation, insurance coverage, and maintenance required.
- Sec. 207. (1) The \$2,749,300.00 appropriated in section 101 for grants to veterans service organizations shall be used only for salaries, wages, related personnel costs, training, and equipment for accredited veteran service advocacy officers and necessary support and managerial staff. Training shall be provided for service advocacy officers and shall be conducted by accredited advocacy officers.
- (2) A congressionally chartered veterans service organization receiving a grant from the funds appropriated in section 101 shall file with the department of military affairs a certified accounting of expenditures of the funds appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1988, and of volunteer hours and services performed by the veterans service organization and its support or auxiliary groups, and a detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1990. The department of military affairs shall submit information required under this section to the senate and house fiscal agencies and to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on military affairs with the budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1990.
- (3) An audit review board is created and shall consist of the director of the house fiscal agency, or his or her designee; the director of the senate fiscal agency, or his or her designee; the director of military affairs, or his or her designee; and 2 members of the Michigan veterans organizations rehabilitation and veterans service committee. The audit review board shall develop guidelines under which a congressionally chartered veterans service organization may receive a grant from the funds appropriated in section 101 and shall establish requirements for program reports that each veterans service organization shall submit to determine program effectiveness and efficiency. The audit review board shall report its findings to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on military affairs not later than January 1, 1989.
- (4) Automatic increases shall not be considered by the legislature for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1989. It is the intent of the legislature that each congressionally chartered veterans service organization's budget for the fiscal year 1989-90 shall be judged individually based upon program effectiveness and efficiency established by the audit review board created by subsection (3).

Sec. 208. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion of contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for utility service to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a manner consistent with the provisions of section 253 of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

Sec. 209. From the \$3,523,200.00 appropriated in section 101 to the headquarters and garrisons appropriations unit for contractual services, supplies, and materials and rental and facility development, \$200,000.00 is provided as rent money for a temporary facility for the Ypsilanti garrison and \$200,000.00 is provided for a grant to Jackson county for fair and exhibition purposes. The appropriation for rent money for a temporary facility for the Ypsilanti garrison is contingent upon the availability of federal funds to begin construction on a new garrison in Ypsilanti township. The appropriation for a grant to Jackson county for fair and exhibition purposes shall be provided based upon a plan developed by the county fair board and the department of military affairs.

Sec. 210. The director of the department of military affairs shall report to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on military affairs any action taken by the department of military affairs to encourage employers' cooperation to allow guard persons to go on active duty and training missions. The director of the department of military affairs may appoint a 5-person advisory commission to assist in formulating necessary possible public policy changes to ensure that a guard person will not lose his or her job because of national guard responsibilities.

Sec. 211. The director of the department of military affairs shall submit a plan and projected cost estimates to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on military affairs for paving the Sault St. Marie garrison parking lot.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
