ENROLLED SENATE BILL No. 822

AN ACT to amend Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, entitled as amended "An act to provide a system of public instruction and elementary and secondary schools; to revise, consolidate, and classify the laws relating to elementary and secondary education; to provide for the classification, organization, regulation, and maintenance of schools, school districts, and intermediate school districts; to prescribe rights, powers, duties, and privileges of schools, school districts, and intermediate school districts; to provide for school elections and to prescribe powers and duties with respect thereto; to provide for the levy and collection of taxes; to provide for the borrowing of money and issuance of bonds and other evidences of indebtedness; to provide for and prescribe the powers and duties of certain boards and officials; to provide for licensure of boarding schools; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," as amended, being sections 380.1 to 380.1852 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, by adding sections 627a and 1303.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, being sections 380.1 to 380.1852 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended by adding sections 627a and 1303 to read as follows:

Sec. 627a. Upon the request of the board of 1 or more constituent school districts, an intermediate school district may coordinate the required educational services provided by 1 or more constituent school districts to homebound or hospitalized pupils, or both.

Sec. 1303. The board of a school district shall not permit any pupil to carry a pocket pager or electronic communication device in school except for health or other unusual reasons approved by the board, and may develop penalties that it considers appropriate for a pupil who violates this prohibition.

Section 2. This amendatory act shall take effect July 1, 1988.
