- 5 Sec. 4. As used in this act:
- 6 (a) "AFIS" means automated fingerprint identification system.
- 7 (b) "AIS/ICF/MR" means alternate intermediate services, intermediate care
- 8 facilities, mentally retarded.
- 9 (c) "CARE" means combined accident reduction effort.
- 10 (d) "CCH" means computerized criminal history.
- 11 (e) "DOJ-BJS" means the United States department of justice, bureau of
- 12 justice statistics.
- 13 (f) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.
- 14 (g) "DOT-NHTSA" means DOT-national highway traffic safety administration.
- (h) "DMB" means the department of management and budget.
- (i) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- 17 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.
- 18 (k) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.
- (m) "MDOT" means Michigan department of transportation.

- Sec. 5. (1) The director of the department of management and budget is
- 22 authorized to make administrative transfers in such amounts as may be
- 23 necessary from amounts appropriated in section 1 to cover current deficits
- 24 created by prorated monthly sick leave payments resulting from employees
- 25 retiring under section 19a of Act No. 240 of the Public Acts of 1943.
- 26 (2) The department of management and budget shall report to the house and
- 27 senate appropriations committees the listing of all administrative transfers

- 1 made under the authority of subsection (1).
- Sec. 6. (1) The amounts appropriated in section 1 for highway safety
- 3 planning programs shall be treated as work project accounts and shall not
- 4 revert to the general fund of the state at the conclusion of the fiscal year
- 5 ending September 30, 1988, but shall continue to be available for expenditure
- 6 until the projects for which they were appropriated are completed or
- 7 otherwise terminated. At the conclusion of the fiscal year ending September
- 8 30, 1988, the unencumbered balance for each completed or terminated project
- 9 shall revert to the general fund and unearned federal funds received for the
- 10 completed or terminated project shall be returned.
- 11 (2) A principal executive officer of a department having an appropriation
- 12 for highway safety planning funds shall notify the director of the department
- 13 of management and budget as to the September 30, 1988, status of each project
- 14 for which appropriations are made. This notification shall be made by the
- 15 following November 1, and shall be in sufficient detail so that the director
- 16 of the department of management and budget can cause the unencumbered balance
- 17 of the completed or terminated projects to be reverted to the general fund of
- 18 the state.
- 19 Sec. 7. The state director of emergency services may call upon all
- 20 agencies or departments of the state and all resources of the state for the
- 21 purpose of protecting life and property and providing for the health and
- 22 safety of the population in any area of the state in which the governor
- 23 proclaims a state of emergency under Act No. 302 of the Public Acts of 1945,
- 24 being sections 10.31 to 10.33 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or Act No. 390
- 25 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 30.401 to 30.420 of the Michigan
- 26 Compiled Laws. The state director of emergency services shall expend the
- 27 amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these purposes. The

- 1 director shall submit to the state budget director as soon as possible a
- 2 complete report of all actions taken under the authority of this section.
- 3 The report shall contain as a separate item a statement of all funds expended
- 4 which were not reimbursable from federal funds. The state budget director
- 5 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the legislature
- 6 in regard to any possible need for a supplemental appropriation.
- 7 Sec. 8. In addition to the appropriations contained in section 1, the
- 8 department of state police may receive funds from local units of government
- 9 for the purpose of expanding or upgrading the law enforcement information
- 10 network, if the funds do not require state money either for matching
- 11 purposes, or for continuing programs if the funds from local units of
- 12 government become unavailable.
- 13 Sec. 9. In addition to the appropriations contained in section 1, the
- 14 department of state police may receive and expend funds from local or private
- 15 sources for the purpose of providing emergency management training to such
- 16 local or private interests.
- 17 Sec. 10. (1) The \$75,000.00 appropriated in section 1 for medical
- 18 transportation is for a pilot project for air and ground transportation of
- 19 persons requiring emergency medical services in the Upper Peninsula and
- 20 northern Lower Peninsula. The pilot project shall be administered by
- 21 Marquette general hospital.
- 22 (2) This medical transportation appropriation is intended to be
- 23 sufficient funding for the third year of a 3-year pilot project providing air
- 24 and ground transportation to and from Marquette general hospital for patients
- 25 with no other resources.
- 26 (3) Marquette general hospital will provide a comprehensive report
- 27 annually to the department of state police including but not limited to:

- 1 (a) The number of trips offered to date and the total cost of services 2 rendered.
- 3 (b) The origin and destination of each trip provided.
- 4 (c) The medical reason for each trip provided.
- 5 (d) The cost of each trip provided.
- 6 (e) The name of the transportation firm utilized for each trip.
- 7 (f) The method of transportation for each trip.
- 8 (4) The annual report shall be submitted no later than October 15, 1988,
- 9 and shall include all services rendered from October 1, 1987 to September 30, 10 1988.
- 11 Sec. 11. The funds appropriated in section 1 for the automated
- 12 fingerprint identification system shall be considered a work project account
- 13 that shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.
- 14 Sec. 12. (1) A steering committee shall be created to assist in the
- 15 development and implementation of a Michigan automated fingerprint
- 16 identification system. The committee shall be comprised of the following
- 17 members:
- 18 (a) The attorney general, or his or her designated representative.
- 19 (b) The secretary of state, or his or her designated representative.
- 20 (c) The director of the department of corrections, or his or her
- 21 designated representative.
- 22 (d) The commissioner of the Detroit police department, or his or her
- 23 designated representative.
- 24 (e) Three representatives of the department of state police, to be
- 25 appointed by the director of the department of state police.
- 26 (f) Three representatives of the Michigan association of chiefs of
- 27 police, to be appointed annually by that association.

- 1 (g) Three representatives of the Michigan sheriff's association, to be 2 appointed annually by that association.
- 3 (h) Three representatives of the prosecuting attorneys association of
- 4 Michigan to be appointed annually by that association.
- 5 (2) The committee shall elect from its membership a chairperson, who
- 6 shall serve 1 year. The committee shall meet quarterly, during the months of
- 7 January, April, July, October, and at other times the chairperson considers
- 8 necessary.
- 9 Sec. 13. In addition to appropriations contained in section 1, the
- 10 department of state police may receive and expend funds from local units of
- 11 government for the purpose of acquiring equipment for the automated
- 12 fingerprint identification system.
- 13 Sec. 14. The appropriations provided in Section 1 for salaries and wages,
- 14 longevity and insurance, retirement, and pension, and for project accounts
- 15 are approved for expenditure for automated information processing which are
- 16 relevant to the objectives of the given appropriation unit or project
- 17 account. Such expenditure shall not be applied to the \$20,000 limitation
- 18 provided in Sec. 203(2) of Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being
- 19 section 18.1203(2) of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- Sec. 15. The \$500,000.00 appropriated in Section 1 for 9-1-1/central
- 21 dispatch is to be used for state participation in state/local central
- 22 dispatch operations associated with 9-1-1 service districts created pursuant
- 23 to Act 32 of the Public Acts of 1986, being sections 484.1101 to 484.1707 of
- 24 the Michigan Complied Laws. The state's participation in a given state/local
- 25 central dispatch operation shall be limited to the provision of 1.0 state
- 26 police sergeant and 50 percent of the cost of central dispatch equipment not
- 27 to exceed \$70,000. The purchase of in-car radios shall not be eligible for

- 1 state funding or for inclusion in the computation of the state share.
- 2 Furthermore, receipt of state funds for equipment is contingent upon
- 3 inclusion of the state police sergeant in the on-going management of the
- 4 central dispatch operation.
- 5 Sec. 16. The \$643,000 appropriated in section 1 for U.P. cooperative drug
- 6 teams shall be limited to operations that include significant financial and
- 7 personnel participation from local units of government.
- 8 Sec. 17. In addition to appropriations contained in Section 1, the
- 9 department of state police may receive or expend funds from local sources for
- 10 the purpose of supporting emergency preparedness response and mitigation
- 11 activity.
- 12 Sec. 18. Included in the appropriation in section 1 for operations
- 13 contractual services, supplies, and materials is \$100,000.00 for a grant to
- 14 fund the Jackson county dispatch operation.
- 15 Sec. 19. Included in the appropriation in section 1 for operations
- 16 contractual services, supplies, and materials is \$28,000.00 for a grant to
- 17 fund the Muskegon county dispatch operation.
- 18 Sec. 20. The transportation funds appropriated and transferred to state
- 19 agencies in section 1 shall be expended pursuant to annual contracts between
- 20 the department of transportation and state agencies providing tax and fee
- 21 collection and other services that are applicable to transportation funds.
- 22 The contracts shall be executed prior to the introduction of the executive
- 23 budget by the governor. The contracts shall specify, but are not limited to,
- 24 the following data applicable to each state agency:
- 25 (a) The estimated costs to be recovered from transportation funds,
- 26 segregated by the agency's spending authorization accounts.
- 27 (b) The description of services financed from the agency's spending 01647 '87

- 1 authorization accounts.
- 2 (c) If a spending authorization account is to be used also for financing
- 3 other than services to transportation funds, the agency shall submit cost
