**A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4365 AS INTRODUCED 3-7-89**

The bill would amend the Vehicle Code to require the Secretary of State to suspend for one year a person's driver's license when that person was convicted of possessing either a) five or more grams of a controlled substance other than marijuana (as defined in that section of the Public Health Code pertaining to controlled substances), or b) 30 or more grams of marijuana, while operating a motor vehicle on a public highway or another place open to the general public at the time of the violation. The prosecuting attorney would have to include a statement on the court-filed complaint stating the nature of the charge, and notifying the person that, if convicted, he or she would lose his or her driving privileges for one year.
