## THE APPARENT PROBLEM:

Michigan's 1963 constitution abolished the office of justice of the peace. Many statutes continue to refer to that office, however. The Michigan Law Revision Commission and others have recommended that obsolete references to justices of the peace be removed from Michigan statute.

### THE CONTENT OF THE BILL:

In general, the bills would amend various acts to replace references to justices of the peace with references to district and municipal judges. <u>House Bill 4752</u> would repeal various apparently obsolete acts, as follows:
