SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 70 as introduced 2-1-89:

The bill would amend the Occupational Code to provide that a person would be subject to the penalty provisions of the Code if the person did not comply with requirements in the Public Health Code on the handling, containment, decontamination, transportation, and disposal of infectious waste, as proposed in Senate Bill 69, in the same manner in which health facilities or agencies would be required to comply with these proposed provision. The bill is tie-barred to Senate Bill 69.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill would have an indeterminate impact on Department of Licensing and Regulation fine revenues. The magnitude and direction of the impact would depend on the number of violations, the degree and cost of enforcement, and the number and size of fines levied.
