SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 245 as introduced 3-9-89:

The bill would amend the School Code to require a school board to ensure that each entrance and exit to a building, in which classroom instruction was provided to elementary pupils, was locked during normal hours of classroom instruction, with allowances made for emergency situations. The board would be required to establish policies and procedures for the bill's implementation.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the State. There would be an indeterminate fiscal impact upon local school districts. The impact is indeterminate because it is not known what kind of monitoring systems to permit the ingress and egress of persons who had a lawful right to enter or exit school buildings would be used by the school districts, nor is it known what liability pursuant to lawsuits could be created by having locked doors on public buildings.
