SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 571 as introduced 10-4-89:

The bill would amend the Highway Advertising Act to authorize townships of any size, rather than townships with a population of 30,000 or more, to enact sign control ordinances. Currently, the Act specifies that it regulates and controls the size, lighting, and spacing of signs and sign structures in adjacent areas and occupies the whole field of that regulation and control, although a township with a population of 30,000 or more, a city, a village, or a charter township may enact sign control ordinances that do not permit a sign or sign structure that is otherwise prohibited by the Act.
