RATIONALE

Efforts have been made during the last decade or so to use gender neutral language in the State's laws, but some Acts still include gender specific terms. The police and fire retirement systems law was drafted in 1937, when few, if any, women were employed as police officers or fire fighters, and the Act's language reflects the original male predominance in those occupations. Some feel that the gender biased language should be removed.

CONTENT

The bill would amend the police and fire retirement systems law to replace gender specific terms with gender neutral language. Under the bill, the law would be known as the "Fire Fighters and Police Officers Retirement Act".

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill would have no fiscal impact on State or local government.

ARGUMENTS

Supporting Argument

The Act's gender biased language is archaic. The bill would reflect the employment of both sexes in the police and fire professions.
