ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 5551

AN ACT to repeal section 13 of Act No. 245 of the Public Acts of 1929, entitled as amended "An act to regulate, protect, and conserve the water resources of the state, to provide for the control over the pollution of any waters of the state and the Great Lakes, to provide for the control over the alteration of the watercourses and the flood plains of all rivers and streams; to create a water resources commission; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to require the registration of manufacturing products, production materials, and waste products where certain wastes are discharged; to require permits to regulate the discharge or storage of any substance which may affect the quality of the waters of the state and to establish restrictions to assure compliance with applicable state standards and to authorize the establishment of permit restrictions and programs to assure compliance with applicable federal law and regulations; to prohibit the pollution of any waters of the state and the Great Lakes; to prohibit the obstruction of the floodways of the rivers and streams of the state; to designate the department of natural resources as the state agency to cooperate and negotiate with other governments and agencies in matters concerning the water resources of the state; and to provide penalties and remedies for the violation of this act," being section 323.13 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 13 of Act No. 245 of the Public Acts of 1929, being section 323.13 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is repealed.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
