February 28, 1989, Introduced by Senators BARCIA, SCHWARZ, FESSLER and O'BRIEN and referred to the Committee on State Affairs, Tourism, and Transportation.

A bill to amend sections 1, 7, and 17 of Act No. 319 of the Public Acts of 1975, entitled

"An act to provide for the registration and regulation of off-road recreation vehicles; and to provide penalties," section 17 as amended by Act No. 166 of the Public Acts of 1985, being sections 257.1601, 257.1607, and 257.1617 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 17a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Sections 1, 7, and 17 of Act No. 319 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1975, section 17 as amended by Act No. 166 of the
- 3 Public Acts of 1985, being sections 257.1601, 257.1607, and
- 4 257.1617 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended and section
- 5 17a is added to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- 1 (A) "ATV" MEANS A MOTORIZED OFF-ROAD VEHICLE THAT IS NOT
- 2 MORE THAN 50 INCHES IN WIDTH, HAS A DRY WEIGHT OF NOT MORE THAN
- 3 600 POUNDS, TRAVELS ON 3 OR MORE LOW PRESSURE TIRES, HAS A SEAT
- 4 DESIGNED TO BE STRADDLED BY THE OPERATOR, AND HAS HANDLEBARS FOR
- 5 STEERING CONTROL.
- 6 (B) -(a) "Commission" means the commission of natural
- 7 resources.
- 8 (C) -(b)- "Dealer" means a person engaged in the sale,
- 9 lease, or rental of an ORV as a regular business.
- (D) (C) "Decal" means a pressure sensitive adhesive backed
- 11 label, of size and color to be determined by the department of
- 12 state, to indicate the certificate of registration number awarded
- 13 the ORV and is valid until the expiration date shown thereon.
- 14 (E) (d) "Department" means department of state.
- (F) (F) "Forest road" means a hard surfaced road, gravel
- 16 or dirt road, fire lane, abandoned railroad right-of-way, logging
- 17 road, or a way capable of travel by a 4-wheel vehicle, except an
- 18 interstate, state, or county highway.
- 19 (G) $\frac{(f)}{(f)}$ "Forest trail" means an existing 1-track path or
- 20 way capable of travel by a 2-wheel or 3-wheel vehicle less than
- 21 40 inches in width.
- 22 (H) $\frac{(g)}{(g)}$ "Highway" means the entire width between the
- 23 boundary lines of a way publicly maintained when any part
- 24 -thereof OF THAT WAY is open to the use of the public for pur-
- 25 poses of vehicular travel.
- 26 (I) (h) "Operate" means to ride in or on, and be in actual
- 27 physical control of the operation of an ORV.

- 1 (J) -(i) "Operator" means a person who operates, or is in 2 actual physical control of the operation of an ORV.
- 3 (K) -(j) "ORV" or "vehicle" means a motor driven off-road
- 4 recreation vehicle capable of cross-country travel without bene-
- 5 fit of a road or trail, on or immediately over land, snow, ice,
- 6 marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain. It includes, but is
- 7 not limited to, AN ATV, a multitrack or multiwheel drive or low
- 8 pressure tire vehicle, a motorcycle or related 2-wheel or 3-wheel
- 9 vehicle, an amphibious machine, a ground effect air cushion vehi-
- 10 cle, or other means of transportation deriving motive power from
- 11 a source other than muscle or wind. "ORV" or "vehicle" does not
- 12 include a registered snowmobile, a farm vehicle being used for
- 13 farming, a vehicle used for military, fire, emergency, or law
- 14 enforcement purposes, a construction or logging vehicle used in
- 15 performance of its common function, or a registered aircraft.
- 16 (ℓ) -(k)- "Owner" means any of the following:
- 17 (i) A vendee or lessee of an ORV which is the subject of an
- 18 agreement for the conditional sale or lease -thereof OF AN ORV,
- 19 with the right of purchase upon performance of the conditions
- 20 stated in the agreement, and with an immediate right of posses-
- 21 sion vested in the conditional vendee or lessee.
- 22 (ii) A person renting an ORV, or having the exclusive use of
- 23 an ORV, for more than 30 days.
- 24 (iii) A person who holds legal ownership of the vehicle.
- 25 (M) $\frac{(\ell)}{(\ell)}$ "Person" means an individual, partnership, corpo-
- 26 ration, the state or any of its agencies or subdivisions, or a
- 27 body of persons whether incorporated or not.

- 1 (N) -(m) "Roadway" means that portion of a highway
- 2 improved, designated, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel.
- 3 If a highway includes 2 or more separate roadways, the term road-
- 4 way refers to a roadway separately, but not to all roadways
- 5 collectively.
- 6 (0) -(n)- "VIN" means a vehicle identification number.
- 7 Sec. 7. The revenue received under this act shall be cred-
- 8 ited to the general fund of the state. From the revenues
- 9 obtained pursuant to section 6, the legislature shall make an
- 10 annual appropriation to the department of state for administra-
- 11 tion of the registration provisions of this act, TO THE DEPART-
- 12 MENT OF EDUCATION FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF AN
- 13 ATV SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAM, and to the department of natural
- 14 resources for purposes of constructing and maintaining trails and
- 15 areas on lands under its control and restoration of public lands
- 16 damaged by ORV use; acquiring and leasing of lands, easements,
- 17 and rights of way to provide for additional trails and areas;
- 18 policing; administration and implementation of -a AN ORV safety
- 19 education and training program; conducting research to off-road
- 20 vehicles and their effects and impact on this state and its envi-
- 21 ronment; and acquiring equipment necessary to implement this
- 22 act. The department of state and the department of natural
- 23 resources shall include in their annual budget requests informa-
- 24 tion detailing these programs. The budget requests shall not
- 25 exceed anticipated revenues.
- 26 Sec. 17. (1) A parent or legal guardian shall not permit a
- 27 child under 12 years of age to operate a vehicle without the

- 1 direct supervision of an adult, except on land owned by, or under
- 2 the control of, the parent or legal guardian.
- 3 (2) The owner or person in charge or in control of a vehicle
- 4 shall not knowingly permit:
- 5 (a) The vehicle to be operated by a person under the age of
- 6 12 without direct AND IMMEDIATE supervision of an adult.
- 7 (b) The vehicle to be operated by a person who is incompe-
- 8 tent to operate the vehicle because of mental or physical dis-
- 9 ability except as provided in section 18, or because the person
- 10 is under the influence of intoxicating liquor; a controlled sub-
- 11 stance as defined by section 7104 of Act No. 368 of the Public
- 12 Acts of 1978, as amended, being section 333.7104 of the Michigan
- 13 Compiled Laws; or a combination of intoxicating liquor and a con-
- 14 trolled substance.
- 15 (3) A PERSON WHO IS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE, BEFORE OPERATING
- 16 AN ATV OR ORV, SHALL COMPLETE AN 8-HOUR ATV SAFETY EDUCATION
- 17 COURSE PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION OR AN 8-HOUR ORV
- 18 SAFETY EDUCATION AND TRAINING COURSE PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT
- 19 OF NATURAL RESOURCES, OR BOTH, AS APPLICABLE. THESE RESPECTIVE
- 20 8-HOUR COURSES SHALL INCLUDE A WRITTEN EXAMINATION AND A DRIVING
- 21 TEST DESIGNED TO TEST THE COMPETENCY OF THE APPLICANT. UPON SUC-
- 22 CESSFUL COMPLETION OF AN ATV OR ORV SAFETY EDUCATION COURSE, OR
- 23 BOTH, AS APPLICABLE, A PERSON SHALL RECEIVE AN ATV OR ORV SAFETY
- 24 CERTIFICATE, OR BOTH, AS APPLICABLE.
- 25 (4) (3) The department of natural resources shall imple-
- 26 ment a comprehensive ORV information, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 27 EDUCATION SHALL IMPLEMENT A COMPREHENSIVE ATV safety education --

- 1 and training program which AND EACH DEPARTMENT shall include
- 2 the preparation and dissemination of information and safety
- 3 advice to the public and training of operators PROMULGATE RULES
- 4 PURSUANT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, ACT
- 5 NO. 306 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1969, BEING SECTIONS 24.201 TO
- 6 24.328 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, REGARDING TEACHER QUALIFI-
- 7 CATIONS, ESTABLISHMENT OF COURSES, AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS UNDER
- 8 THIS SECTION. The program PROGRAMS shall provide for the
- 9 training of youthful operators and for the issuance of ATV AND
- 10 ORV safety certificates to those who successfully complete the
- 11 -training provided under the program RESPECTIVE PROGRAMS.
- 12 (5) (4) In implementing a program which is PROGRAMS
- 13 established pursuant to this section, the department of natural
- 14 resources AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION shall cooperate with
- 15 private organizations and associations, private and public corpo-
- 16 rations, the department of -education STATE, and local govern-
- 17 mental units. The department of natural resources AND THE
- 18 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION shall consult with ATV, ORV, and environ-
- 19 mental organizations and associations in regard to THE subject
- 20 matter of a -training SAFETY EDUCATION program and performance
- 21 testing that leads to certification of ATV AND ORV operators.
- 22 (6) +(5) The department of natural resources +may AND THE
- 23 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL EACH designate a
- 24 person it considers qualified to provide course instruction TO
- 25 BE THE STATE COORDINATOR OF THE RESPECTIVE ORV AND ATV SAFETY
- 26 EDUCATION PROGRAMS and to award ATV AND ORV safety certificates.
- 27 THE PERSONS DESIGNATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MUST HAVE

- 1 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AN ATV OR ORV SAFETY CHIEF INSTRUCTOR
- 2 COURSE, AS APPLICABLE, AS PROVIDED BY THE RESPECTIVE DEPARTMENTS.
- 3 (7) THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE SUPERINTEN-
- 4 DENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL EACH DESIGNATE A PERSON WHO HAS
- 5 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED AN ATV OR ORV SAFETY CHIEF INSTRUCTOR
- 6 COURSE, AS APPLICABLE, TO PERFORM ANNUAL INSPECTIONS OF SAFETY
- 7 COURSE SITES.
- 8 (8) -(6) A person who is at least 12 years of age but less
- 9 than 16 years of age may operate BEFORE OPERATING an ATV OR ORV
- 10 -if that person satisfies any SHALL SATISFY ALL of the
- 11 following:
- 12 (a) Is— OPERATE THE ATV OR ORV under the direct supervision
- 13 of a person who is 18 years of age or older.
- 14 (b) —IS OPERATE THE ATV OR ORV on land owned or under the
- 15 control of a parent or legal quardian.
- 16 (c) Has HAVE in his or her immediate possession an ATV OR
- 17 ORV safety certificate issued pursuant to subsection (3) THIS
- 18 SECTION.
- 19 (d) Possesses an ORV safety certificate issued under the
- 20 authority of another state or a province of Canada.
- 21 (9) (7) When operating an ATV OR ORV under subdivision
- 22 (c) or (d), SUBSECTION (8)(C), that person shall present the ATV
- 23 OR ORV safety certificate to a peace officer upon demand.
- 24 (10) -(8) Notwithstanding any other provision of this sec-
- 25 tion, an operator who is under 12 years of age shall not cross a
- 26 highway or street. An operator who is at least 12 years of age
- 27 but less than 16 years of age may cross a highway or street or

- 1 operate on the right of way or shoulder of designated access
- 2 routes pursuant to section 18 if the operator has a valid ATV OR
- 3 ORV safety certificate in his or her immediate possession.
- 4 SEC. 17A. (1) AN ATV OR ORV SAFETY EDUCATION COURSE
- 5 REQUIRED IN SECTION 17 MAY BE CONDUCTED BY A PRIVATE BUSINESS
- 6 ENTERPRISE.
- 7 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF NATU-
- 8 RAL RESOURCES SHALL PROMULGATE RULES PURSUANT TO THE ADMINISTRA-
- 9 TIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, ACT NO. 306 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF
- 10 1969, BEING SECTIONS 24.201 TO 24.328 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED
- 11 LAWS, TO PROVIDE STANDARDS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND REGULATION
- 12 OF ATV AND ORV SAFETY EDUCATION COURSES CONDUCTED UNDER THIS SEC-
- 13 TION AND AWARDING OF ATV AND ORV SAFETY CERTIFICATES.
