SENATE BILL No. 312

April 13, 1989, Introduced by Senators FAUST and O'BRIEN referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to create the Michigan historical commission in the department of management and budget; to transfer the authority of the bureau of history of the department of state to the Michigan historical commission; to prescribe the duties and powers of the Michigan historical commission; to create the Michigan heritage publications fund; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan history act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Agency" means the state, a county, a municipality,
- 5 including a city, village, or township, a school district, a mul-
- 6 ticounty unit of government, or a department, board, or
- 7 commission of the state, county, municipality, or multicounty
- 8 unit of government.

- (b) "Commission" means the Michigan historical commission
 created in section 3.
- 3 (c) "Department" means the department of management and 4 budget.
- 5 (d) "Record" means a document, paper, book, letter, or other
- 6 writing, whether prepared by handwriting, typewriting, printing,
- 7 photostating, or photocopying; a photograph, film, map, magnetic
- 8 or paper tape, microform, magnetic or punch card, disc, drum,
- 9 sound or video recording, electronic data processing material, or
- 10 other recording medium; and includes individual letters, words,
- 11 pictures, sounds, impulses, or symbols, or a combination, regard-
- 12 less of physical form or characteristics.
- 13 Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan historical commission is created
- 14 within, but not as a part of the department of management and
- 15 budget. The commission shall exercise the commission's pre-
- 16 scribed statutory powers, duties, and functions independently of
- 17 the department. The budgeting, procurement, and related func-
- 18 tions of the commission shall be performed under the direction
- 19 and supervision of the department.
- 20 (2) The commission shall consist of 12 members, including
- 21 all of the following:
- (a) Six members appointed by the governor.
- 23 (b) Four legislators, 1 from the majority party and 1 from
- 24 the minority party in each house to be appointed by the respec-
- 25 tive party leaders in each house.
- 26 (c) The governor, ex officio.

- (3) A legislator appointed to the commission holds office 2 for a term of 2 years coinciding with the terms of office of the 3 house of representatives. A member appointed by the governor who 4 is serving on the commission on the effective date of this act 5 shall finish his or her term. A member appointed by the governor 6 on and after the effective date of this act holds office for a 7 term of 3 years.
- (4) The commission shall prescribe rules for its own 9 procedure. Annually, the commission shall elect from its member-10 ship a chairperson, vice-chairperson, and secretary. A member 11 shall serve without compensation but is entitled to reasonable 12 and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of his or her 13 duties.
- 14 The commission shall do all of the following:
- 15 (a) Collect, preserve, and display in museums materials
- 16 related to the history of Michigan as described in section 6.
- (b) Administer historic preservation programs pursuant to 18 Act No. 10 of the Public Acts of 1955, being sections 399.151 to
- 19 399.152 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and as described in sec-
- 20 tion 7.

- 21 (c) Together with the department of natural resources, pro-
- 22 tect and administer the historical interests of the state in
- 23 abandoned property and aboriginal remains pursuant to Act No. 173
- 24 of the Public Acts of 1929, being sections 299.51 to 299.55 of
- 25 the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 26 (d) Perform all of the duties necessary to maintaining the
- 27 state archives, as described in sections 8 and 9.

- (e) Perform all of the duties related to historical
- 2 publications as described in section 10.
- 3 (f) Cooperate with, and encourage the development of, local
- 4 historical societies in the state.
- 5 (g) Make recommendations to the legislature on budget and
- 6 other matters of general policy concerning the history of the 7 state.
- 8 (h) Develop procedures for carrying out this act.
- 9 (i) Perform all of the duties related to the history of the
- 10 state of Michigan that were performed by the bureau of history of
- 11 the department of state before the effective date of this act.
- (j) Employ administrative assistants and employees necessary
- 13 or desirable for the management of the programs authorized by
- 14 this act.
- (k) Make an annual report to the legislature on the opera-
- 16 tions of the commission during the preceding year.
- 17 Sec. 6. (1) The commission shall maintain and operate a
- 18 museum in the Michigan library and historical center to display
- 19 for the public its collection of objects and materials related to
- 20 the history of Michigan. It shall accept donations on behalf of
- 21 the state for this purpose.
- (2) The commission shall maintain and operate the Michigan
- 23 iron industry museum in conjunction with the Carp river forge
- 24 advisory board pursuant to the carp river forge advisory board
- 25 act, Act No. 152 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections
- 26 399.71 to 399.76 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

- 1 Sec. 7. (1) The commission shall maintain and operate
- 2 historic sites owned by the state. The commission may do all of
- 3 the following:
- 4 (a) Acquire or accept real property or rights in real prop-
- 5 erty in the name of the state and for the benefit of the public,
- 6 either by purchase, gift, or devise.
- 7 (b) Accept on behalf of the state a gift or bequest of money
- 8 or other nonhistoric personal property made for the purposes of
- 9 this act. Money received for this purpose shall be turned over
- 10 to the state treasurer for investment, and the invested funds
- 11 shall be known as the state historic site fund. The proceeds
- 12 shall be used, under the direction of the council, to carry out
- 13 the purposes of this act.
- 14 (c) Accept from a municipality the care and control of an
- 15 historic site or property suitable as an historic site. The
- 16 transfer from the municipality shall be upon terms mutually
- 17 agreeable to the commission and the municipality.
- 18 (2) The commission shall maintain a register of historic
- 19 sites pursuant to Act No. 10 of the Public Acts of 1955, being
- 20 sections 399.151 to 399.152 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 21 (3) The commission shall appoint a state historic preserva-
- 22 tion officer to administer the historic preservation programs of
- 23 the state, including any programs operated with federal
- 24 assistance.
- Sec. 8. (1) The commission shall operate the state archives
- 26 as a record depository to ensure the permanent preservation of
- 27 state and local public records that document the growth and

- 1 development of Michigan or that contain significant information
- 2 related to the functioning of Michigan government.
- 3 (2) All public officers of the state shall assist the com-
- 4 mission in the performance of the duties required in this section
- 5 and in section 9.
- 6 (3) The commission shall appoint a state archivist to admin-
- 7 ister the programs authorized in this section.
- 8 (4) In operating the state archives, the commission shall do
- 9 all of the following:
- (a) Collect from all agencies in the state records that are
- 11 not in current use and that are of value, as determined by the
- 12 commission.
- (b) Accept from any nongovernmental person or entity a
- 14 record that the commission determines to have value.
- (c) Preserve and maintain all records contained in the state
- 16 archives on the effective date of this act, including records of
- 17 the office of commissioner of immigration and of any other office
- 18 that no longer exists in this state.
- (d) Classify, arrange, and index the records contained in
- 20 the state archives so that they are available for the use of the
- 21 public.
- (e) Make available for public inspection and copying any
- 23 record that is not confidential, unless the record would be dam-
- 24 aged by such availability.
- 25 (f) Designate local archival depositories that meet criteria
- 26 determined by the commission for the preservation of local
- 27 records.

- 1 (5) When certified by the state archivist or his or her
 2 designee, a copy of a record has the same legal force and effect
 3 as if made by the agency from which the record was transferred.
- 4 (6) A record obtained by the commission under a written
 5 agreement specifying that the record is for retention in the
 6 state archives, but is confidential, shall be kept confidential
 7 and shall not be open to public inspection or copying for a
 8 period set forth in the agreement. The period set forth in the
 9 agreement shall end no later than 20 years from the date of the
 10 agreement or on the death of the donor, whichever occurs first.
- 11 (7) A public record transferred to the commission by an
 12 agency that maintained the record on a confidential or privileged
 13 basis shall be kept confidential if a written agreement to that
 14 effect is executed concerning the transfer. The agreement shall
 15 be signed by the state archivist and a representative of the
 16 agency, specify the terms and conditions under which the record
 17 is to be transferred, and may include a provision for the release
 18 of the record for research purposes if the names of persons iden19 tified in the record are protected from disclosure.
- 20 (8) Subsection (7) does not apply to a public record that
 21 failed to qualify for an exemption from the disclosure require22 ments of the freedom of information act, Act No. 442 of the
 23 Public Acts of 1976, being sections 15.231 to 15.246 of the
 24 Michigan Compiled Laws, before receipt by the commission or its
 25 predecessor.
- Sec. 9. (1) A record that is required by law to be kept by 27 a public officer or that is a written memorial of a transaction

- 1 of a public officer in the discharge of his or her duty is the
- 2 property of the state and shall not be disposed of except as pro-
- 3 vided in this section. This section does not apply to bonds,
- 4 bills, notes, interest coupons, or other evidences of indebted-
- 5 ness issued by an agency.
- 6 (2) A state or local agency shall present to the commission
- 7 a disposal schedule containing a list or description of the
- 8 records that it certifies to be of no current use and of no value
- 9 to the agency. The commission shall review the schedule and
- 10 inspect the list or description of records, or the records them-
- 11 selves, to determine which records are of value and should be
- 12 retained in the state archives. The commission shall direct the
- 13 agency to transfer to the state archives those records determined
- 14 by the commission to be of value.
- (3) After the commission has reviewed the disposal schedule
- 16 and the valuable records have been transferred to the state
- 17 archives, the agency shall submit the schedule to the state
- 18 administrative board, which shall approve or disapprove the dis-
- 19 posal schedule and order the destruction of the valueless records
- 20 accordingly.
- 21 Sec. 10. (1) The commission shall publish bulletins, a his-
- 22 torical journal, book reprints, maps, articles, calendars, source
- 23 materials, historical studies, and other related materials that,
- 24 in the opinion of the commission, contribute to the understanding
- 25 and appreciation of the history of Michigan. The expenses of
- 26 publication shall be paid out of appropriations made by the
- 27 legislature or out of the fund created by subsection (3).

- 1 (2) The commission may sell the published materials
- 2 described in subsection (1) at prices determined by the
- 3 commission. The commission shall furnish free copies of the his-
- 4 torical journal upon request to each cooperative library of the
- 5 state and to each member of the legislature, and it may distrib-
- 6 ute to or exchange with other states, foreign governments, and
- 7 private institutions published materials developed under this
- 8 act.
- 9 (3) A revolving fund called the Michigan heritage publica-
- 10 tions fund is created in the department of treasury. Except as
- 11 otherwise provided in section 7, money collected by the commis-
- 12 sion shall be credited to the fund. The printing, distribution,
- 13 and promotion costs incurred by the publications authorized in
- 14 this section shall be paid from the fund, to the extent
- 15 possible.
- 16 Sec. 11. The following sections and acts are repealed:
- 17 (a) Act No. 31 of the Public Acts of 1885, being section
- 18 11.113 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- (b) Act No. 271 of the Public Acts of 1913, being sections
- 20 399.1 to 399.9 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 21 (c) Act No. 69 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections
- 22 399.111 to 399.113 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 23 (d) Section 30 of Act No. 380 of the Public Acts of 1965,
- 24 being section 16.130 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 25 Sec. 12. This act shall not take effect unless all of the
- 26 following bills of the 85th Legislature are enacted into law:
