A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILLS 5102-5104 AS INTRODUCED 9-11-91

The bills would require insurers, health maintenance organizations (HMOs), and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michigan to offer to provide coverage to the child of an insured until December 31st of the year in which the child (by birth or adoption) becomes 25 years of age if the child is unmarried and enrolled as a full-time student. (Under the bills, it would not matter whether or not the child was considered a dependent under the federal Internal Revenue Code.) House Bill 5102 would amend the Insurance Code (MCL 500.3406f) to apply to expense-incurred hospital, medical, or surgical policies of commercial insurers. House Bill 5103 would amend the Nonprofit Health Care Corporation Reform Act (MCL 550.1418) to apply to certificates of Blue Cross-Blue Shield. House Bill 5104 would amend the Public Health Code (MCL 333.21054u) to apply to HMO contracts.
