**CHAUFFEUR'S LIC. EXEMPTION**

**A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 5126 AS INTRODUCED 9-12-91**

The Michigan Vehicle Code distinguishes between drivers of different types of vehicles, requiring drivers that operate vehicles primarily for commercial purposes to obtain a chauffeur's license and special endorsements depending on the type of vehicle to be driven. The bill would amend the act to provide that a person who drove a motor vehicle for delivering prepared food free of charge to a customer would not have to obtain a chauffeur's license or any special commercial endorsements, as long as driving for this purpose was not the person's "exclusive duty." Under the bill, a commercial vehicle would not include a motor vehicle used to provide free delivery of prepared food to customers.
