ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 5028

AN ACT to amend section 5 of Act No. 234 of the Public Acts of 1988, entitled "An act to create the Vietnam veterans memorial monument fund; to establish a commission to govern the monument fund; to prescribe the purpose of the monument fund; to prescribe the powers and duties of the commission and certain state departments and officers; to provide for legislative oversight; and to provide for dissolution of the commission and monument fund," being section 35.1055 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 5 of Act No. 234 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 35.1055 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 5. (1) The commission shall oversee the financing and construction of a memorial monument dedicated to Vietnam veterans from Michigan who died or are listed as missing in action as a result of the Vietnam conflict. The commission shall solicit designs for the monument and shall select the final design.

(2) The names of each Michigan Vietnam veteran who died or is listed as missing in action as a result of the Vietnam conflict shall be inscribed on the Vietnam veterans memorial monument.

(3) The Vietnam veterans memorial monument shall be located on a state owned site of not more than 1 acre that meets all of the following criteria:

(a) The site is directly west of the peak of the capitol dome.

(b) The site is located on the easternmost portion of land within boundaries commencing at the E 1/4 corner of Section 17, T4N, R2W, City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan; thence westerly approximately 470 feet, on the E-W 1/4 line of said Section 17 to the point of beginning; thence southerly approximately 295 feet, to the right-of-way line of the proposed capitol loop; thence approximately 840 feet, on the arc of a curve to the right with a central angle of approximately 160 degrees and a radius of approximately 300 feet on said right-of-way; thence southerly approximately 295 feet, to the point of beginning, containing 2.5 acres, more or less. The described parcel is subject to any easement or right of record pertaining to that parcel.

(c) The site is located midway between Allegan street and Ottawa street.

Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless all of the following bills of the 86th Legislature are enacted into law:

(a) Senate Bill No. 704.

(b) House Bill No. 4995.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
