A bill to create the Michigan police officers memorial monument; to establish a commission to oversee the financing and construction of the memorial monument; to create the monument fund within the department of treasury; to prescribe the purpose of the monument fund; to prescribe the powers and duties of the commission and certain state departments and officers; to provide for legislative oversight; and to provide for dissolution of the commission and monument fund.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan police officers memorial act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Commission" means the Michigan police officers memorial
- 5 monument commission established in section 4.

- (b) "Killed" means that a traumatic injury or a disease
- 2 caused by or resulting from a traumatic injury is a substantial
- 3 factor in the individual's death.
- 4 (c) "Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan police
- 5 officer is obligated or authorized to perform by rule, regula-
- 6 tion, condition of employment or service, or law including, but
- 7 not limited to, those social, ceremonial, or athletic functions
- 8 that the Michigan police officer is assigned to or compensated
- 9 for by the public agency he or she serves.
- (d) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's
- 11 deputy; village or township marshal; officer of the police
- 12 department of a city, village, or township; officer of the
- 13 Michigan state police; or another police officer or law enforce-
- 14 ment officer trained and certified pursuant to the Michigan law
- 15 enforcement officers training council act of 1965, Act No. 203 of
- 16 the Public Acts of 1965, being sections 28.601 to 28.616 of the
- 17 Michigan Compiled Laws.
- (e) "Monument fund" means the Michigan police officers memo-
- 19 rial monument fund created in section 5.
- 20 (f) "Occupational disease" means a disease that routinely
- 21 constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded as con-
- 22 comitant of the Michigan police officer's occupation.
- 23 (g) "State capitol grounds" means the property upon which
- 24 the state capitol building is situated, bordered on the north by
- 25 Ottawa street; on the east by Capitol avenue; on the south by
- 26 Allegan street; and on the west by Walnut street.

- 1 (h) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition of the
- 2 body caused by external force including, but not limited to,
- 3 injuries inflicted by bullets, explosives, sharp instruments,
- 4 blunt objects or other physical blows, chemicals, electricity,
- 5 climatic conditions, infectious diseases, radiation, and bacter-
- 6 ia, but excluding stress, strain, or occupational diseases.
- 7 Sec. 3. (1) The commission shall oversee the financing and
- 8 construction of a memorial monument dedicated to Michigan police
- 9 officers killed in the line of duty that shall be located on the
- 10 state capitol grounds. The commission shall solicit designs for
- 11 the monument and shall select the final design. The commission
- 12 may contract with the department of management and budget or any
- 13 other public or private entity. The current labor and trades and
- 14 safety and regulatory classifications performing duties on the
- 15 state capitol grounds shall be maintained.
- 16 (2) The name of each Michigan police officer killed in the
- 17 line of duty shall be inscribed on the monument.
- 18 Sec. 4. (1) The Michigan police officers memorial monument
- 19 commission is established as the governing body of the monument
- 20 fund. The commission consists of 9 members. The governor shall
- 21 appoint 5 members of the commission, not less than 2 of whom
- 22 shall be Michigan police officers. The speaker of the house of
- 23 representatives and the senate majority leader shall each appoint
- 24 2 members of the commission. Not less than 1 of each of those 2
- 25 shall be a Michigan police officer. Subject to section 7, com-
- 26 mission members shall be appointed for 4-year terms and may be

- 1 reappointed. A vacancy in the commission shall be filled in the
 2 same manner as originally appointed.
- 3 (2) The commission shall initially convene within 6 months
- 4 after the first deposit of money in the monument fund. The com-
- 5 mission shall meet often enough to expedite the completion of the
- 6 monument as prescribed in section 3. A majority of the members
- 7 of the commission constitutes a quorum for conducting business.
- 8 (3) The commission shall conduct its business at public
- 9 meetings held in compliance with the open meetings act, Act
- 10 No. 267 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 15.261 to
- 11 15.275 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. A writing prepared, owned,
- 12 used, in the possession of, or retained by the commission in the
- 13 performance of an official function shall be available to the
- 14 public in compliance with the freedom of information act, Act
- 15 No. 442 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 15.231 to
- 16 15.246 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 17 (4) A member of the commission is not entitled to per diem
- 18 compensation, but each member of the commission is entitled to
- 19 actual and necessary travel expenses and other expenses incurred
- 20 in the performance of official duties under this act.
- 21 Sec. 5. The Michigan police officers memorial monument fund
- 22 is created as a separate fund in the department of treasury. The
- 23 state treasurer shall credit to the monument fund the money
- 24 appropriated to the monument fund and money received for the mon-
- 25 ument fund under section 6.
- Sec. 6. The commission may accept on behalf of the monument
- 27 fund grants or gifts from the federal government, an individual,

- 1 a public or private corporation, organization, or foundation, or
- 2 any other source. The acceptance and use of federal funds by the
- 3 commission does not commit state money and does not obligate the
- 4 legislature to continue the purposes for which federal money is
- 5 made available. The commission shall transmit money received
- 6 under this section to the state treasurer for deposit in the mon-
- 7 ument fund.
- 8 Sec. 7. After the completion of construction of the monu-
- 9 ment pursuant to section 3 and payment of all amounts due in con-
- 10 nection with the monument, the commission is dissolved. The
- 11 state treasurer shall credit the department of management and
- 12 budget with any balance remaining in the monument fund. Money
- 13 credited to the department of management and budget shall be used
- 14 for the purpose of construction or maintenance of other monuments
- 15 dedicated to public service or military personnel.
- 16 Sec. 8. The office of criminal justice in the department of
- 17 management and budget shall do all of the following:
- (a) Determine if a Michigan police officer was killed in the
- 19 line of duty.
- 20 (b) Before the completion of construction of the memorial
- 21 monument under this act, provide to the commission a list of
- 22 names of Michigan police officers killed in the line of duty.
- (c) After the completion of construction of the memorial
- 24 monument under this act, provide the names of Michigan police
- 25 officers killed in the line of duty to the Michigan capitol
- 26 committee. The names of the Michigan police officers killed in
- 27 the line of duty shall be added to the memorial monument.
