HOUSE BILL No. 4379

February 26, 1991, Introduced by Reps. Barns, Hoffman, Walberg, Kilpatrick, DeMars, Nye, McNutt, Knight and Robertson and referred to the Committee on House Oversight.

A bill to amend sections 3, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 of Act No. 415 of the Public Acts of 1982, entitled "Correctional officers' training act of 1982," sections 10, 11, 12, and 13 as amended by Act No. 4 of the Public Acts of 1989, being sections 791.503, 791.509, 791.510, 791.511, 791.512, and 791.513 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Sections 3, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 of Act No. 415
- 2 of the Public Acts of 1982, sections 10, 11, 12, and 13 as
- 3 amended by Act No. 4 of the Public Acts of 1989, being sections
- 4 791.503, 791.509, 791.510, 791.511, 791.512, and 791.513 of the
- 5 Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 3. The correctional officer's training council is
- 7 created within the department and shall establish standards
- 8 regarding training and education as prescribed in this act. The

- 1 council shall consist of 10 members appointed by the governor.
- 2 The members shall be appointed as follows:
- 3 (a) One member shall represent state corrections officers.
- 4 (b) One member shall represent local corrections officers.
- 5 (c) One member shall represent local agencies which maintain
- 6 jails, corrections, or temporary holding facilities.
- 7 (d) One member shall represent the Michigan commission of
- 8 corrections DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT.

- 7 1984, shall not be certified or recertified by the -Michigan com-

- (b) Successfully completed all of the following:

- 14 (2) A person who is WAS employed as a correctional officer
- 15 or an immediate supervisor of a correctional officer at the
- 16 former Detroit house of correction on December 31, 1984 shall
- 17 automatically be certified and annually recertified by the
- 18 Michigan commission of corrections DEPARTMENT until
- 19 December 31, 1985. Beginning January 1, 1986, a person who is
- 20 WAS employed as a correctional officer or an immediate supervisor
- 21 of a correctional officer at the former Detroit house of correc-
- 22 tion on December 31, 1984 shall not be recertified unless he or
- 23 she has done both of the following:
- 24 (a) Completed successfully a minimum of 160 hours of train-

 9 recertified by the commission of corrections DEPARTMENT for 3
 10 years following the date he or she became employed as a state
 11 correctional officer provided he or she has done all of the
 12 following:
- (a) Within I year of the date he or she became employed as a 14 state correctional officer, obtained a high school diploma or 15 attained a passing score on the general education development 16 test indicating a high school graduation level.
- 17 (b) Within 1 year of the date he or she became employed as a
 18 state correctional officer, completed successfully 320 hours of
 19 new employee training with a credit up to 160 hours of previously
 20 acquired training, as approved by the council.
- 21 (c) Within 3 years of the date he or she became employed as 22 a state correctional officer, completed 1 of the following:
- (i) A vocational certificate program, as determined by the
 council, earned from an accredited postsecondary educational
 institution, which program shall require a minimum of 15 semester
 credit hours or 23 term credit hours.

- 1 (ii) Equivalent course work to a vocational certificate
- 2 program, as determined by the council, earned from an accredited
- 3 postsecondary educational institution which course work shall
- 4 require a minimum of 15 semester credit hours or 23 term credit
- 5 hours. The credit hours required under this subparagraph may be
- 6 earned before or after the effective date of the amendatory act
- 7 that added this subparagraph.
- 8 (iii) A degree granted by an accredited postsecondary educa-
- 9 tional institution in a major discipline of study that is rele-
- 10 vant to the position of state correctional officer, as determined
- 11 by the council. A degree required under this subparagraph may be
- 12 earned before or after the effective date of the amendatory act
- 13 that added this subparagraph.
- (d) Fulfilled other minimum standards and requirements
- 15 developed pursuant to section 13 by the council and approved by
- 16 the commission of corrections DEPARTMENT for certification and
- 17 subsequently for recertification.
- 18 (4) All minimum standards and requirements for certification
- 19 and subsequently for recertification of persons under subsections
- 20 (1), (2), and (3) shall be subject to approval by the state-civil
- 21 service commission.
- Sec. 13. (1) Not later than June 30, 1983, and as often as
- 23 necessary after that, the council shall develop minimum standards
- 24 and requirements for state correctional officers with respect to
- 25 the following:
- 26 (a) Recruitment, selection, and certification of new state
- 27 correctional officers based upon at least, but not limited to,

- 1 work experience, educational achievement, and physical and mental
 2 fitness.
- 3 (b) New employee and continuing training programs.
- 4 (c) Recertification process.
- 5 (d) Course content of the vocational certificate program,
- 6 required in section 12, the central training academy, and con-
- 7 tinuing training programs.
- 8 (e) Decertification process.
- 9 (2) Standards and requirements developed by the council
- 10 under this section shall be effective only if they are approved
- 11 by the -commission of corrections DEPARTMENT.
- 12 (3) Standards and requirements approved by the -commission
- 13 of corrections DEPARTMENT under this section shall be subject to
- 14 approval by the state civil service commission.
- 15 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
