## **HOUSE BILL No. 4395**

February 27, 1991, Introduced by Reo. Hertel and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans! Affairs.

A bill to establish a medical assistance program for dependents of members of the armed forces of the United States or the armed forces of this state who are serving combat duty; and to prescribe certain powers and duties of the department of social services.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "military dependents medical assistance act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Armed forces" means the armed services of the United
- 5 States or the armed services of this state.
- 6 (b) "Combat duty status" means that a member of the armed
- 7 forces is on active duty in an area of imminent danger with a
- 8 possibility of combat.

- (c) "Department" means the department of social services.
- 2 (d) "Dependent" means that term as defined in section 152 of
- 3 the internal revenue code, title 26 of the United States code.
- 4 (e) "Medical assistance" means a program of assistance that
- 5 includes medical benefits identical to those provided pursuant to
- 6 section 105 of the social welfare act, Act No. 280 of the Public
- 7 Acts of 1939, being section 400.105 of the Michigan Compiled
- 8 Laws.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall establish a program to
- 10 provide medical assistance to dependents of members of the armed
- 11 forces who are on combat duty status, as prescribed by this act.
- 12 (2) A person is eligible to receive medical assistance under
- 13 this act if all of the following circumstances exist:
- (a) He or she is a dependent of a member of the armed forces
- 15 who is in combat duty status.
- (b) He or she is not eligible for any other medical assist-
- 17 ance program or health insurance coverage.
- (c) He or she is a member of a household having an income
- 19 level of no more than 200% of the income level for eligibility
- 20 under the medicaid program established pursuant to section 105 of
- 21 Act No. 280 of the Public Acts of 1939.
- (3) The period of eligibility for medical assistance under
- 23 this act begins on the date the member of the armed forces
- 24 assumes combat duty status or the effective date of this act,
- 25 whichever is later, and ends 12 months after the date on which
- 26 combat duty status ends.

Sec. 4. The department may promulgate rules pursuant to the 2 administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public 3 Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of the Michigan 4 Compiled Laws, to implement this act.
