

# HOUSE BILL No. 4452

March 5, 1991, Introduced by Reps. Niederstadt, Bartnik, Pitoniak, Byrum, Baade, McNutt, Anthony, Dobronski, Middaugh and Dalman and referred to the Committee on Towns and Counties.

A bill to amend section 514 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, entitled  
"Michigan election law,"  
being section 168.514 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 514 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of  
2 1954, being section 168.514 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 514. ~~When~~ IF the registration of ~~any~~ AN elector  
5 is cancelled, the clerk shall ~~cause to be made~~ MAKE a proper  
6 entry on the original and duplicate registration cards, indicat-  
7 ing the date and the cause for cancellation, and shall affix his  
8 OR HER signature ~~thereto~~ TO THE ENTRIES. All copies of the  
9 cancelled registration cards shall be filed in the office of the  
10 clerk. All duplicates of the original registration cards so

1 cancelled may be destroyed 2 years after the registrations ~~were~~  
2 ARE cancelled. The clerk may also destroy the original registra-  
3 tion cards of ~~any~~ AN elector 10 years after the date of cancel-  
4 lation of the elector's registration, if the registration ~~has~~  
5 IS not ~~been~~ reinstated within that period. The clerk may also  
6 destroy any cancelled original registration cards 2 years after  
7 the date of cancellation if the cancelled registration cards  
8 ~~have been~~ ARE reproduced ~~on film~~ PURSUANT TO THE RECORDS  
9 MEDIA ACT and the ~~film is~~ REPRODUCTIONS ARE on file in the  
10 office of the clerk. The ~~film~~ REPRODUCTIONS may be destroyed  
11 after the EXPIRATION OF THE statutory retention date of ~~all~~ THE  
12 REPRODUCED records. ~~recorded thereon has expired.~~ The  
13 ~~destruction of all such~~ registration records, IF COMBUSTIBLE,  
14 shall be DESTROYED by burning.

15 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless  
16 Senate Bill No. \_\_\_\_\_ or House Bill No. 4438 (request  
17 no. 01788'91) of the 86th Legislature is enacted into law.
