## **HOUSE BILL No. 4983**

June 20, 1991, Introduced by Rep. Bouchard and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Youth.

A bill to require certain disclosures by certain persons having or seeking to have care of, or supervisory or disciplinary power over, minors; to permit criminal history checks of such persons; to prescribe the powers and duties and limit the liability of certain departments and agencies; and to prescribe penalties.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "child-related employment criminal history check act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Applicant" means a person seeking to become an employee
- 5 or volunteer of an employer.
- 6 (b) "Criminal history check" means a determination by the
- 7 department through the use of the law enforcement information
- 8 network and records to which the department has access of whether

- 1 a person has been convicted of a crime in this or another state
  2 and the nature of the crime and conviction.
- 3 (c) "Department" means the department of state police.
- 4 (d) "Employee" means an employer's paid employee who has the 5-care of, or supervisory or disciplinary powers over, a minor.
- 6 (e) "Employer" means any of the following that employs or
- 7 uses the services of a paid employee or volunteer:
- 8 (i) A child care organization as defined in section 1 of Act
- 9 No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1973, being section 722.111 of the
- 10 Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 11 (ii) An adult foster care family home or adult foster care
- 12 small group home as defined in section 3 of the adult foster care
- 13 facility licensing act, Act No. 218 of the Public Acts of 1979,
- 14 being section 400.703 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 15 (iii) A private or public school with any grade from kinder-
- 16 garten to twelfth grade.
- 17 (iv) A public or private intermediate or long-term care
- 18 facility providing care or treatment for a mental, physical, emo-
- 19 tional, or rehabilitative condition or disease for a child.
- 20 (v) A juvenile facility as defined in section 2 of the juve-
- 21 nile facilities act, Act No. 73 of the Public Acts of 1988, being
- 22 section 803.222 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 23 (f) "Volunteer" means a person providing voluntary services
- 24 to an employer and who has the care of, or supervisory or disci-
- 25 plinary power over, a minor in that capacity.
- Sec. 3. (1) An employer shall obtain from each applicant,
- 27 employee, or volunteer a signed statement of whether the

- 1 applicant, employee, or volunteer has ever been convicted of any
- 2 of the following offenses in this state or under the statutes of
- 3 the United States or another state and, if so, the details of the
- 4 conviction:
- 5 (a) A felony.
- 6 (b) A misdemeanor that is a sexual offense, or that involves
- 7 child abuse or an act of violence against a minor.
- 8 (c) An attempt or conspiracy to commit an offense described
- 9 in subdivision (a) or (b).
- 10 (2) An applicant, employee, or volunteer who knowingly or
- 11 intentionally makes a false statement or withholds information in
- 12 connection with the signed statement required under subsection
- 13 (1) is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for
- 14 not more than 6 months or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or
- 15 both.
- 16 Sec. 4. (1) An applicant, employee, or volunteer shall give
- 17 written consent for his or her employer to conduct a criminal
- 18 history check.
- 19 (2) An employer may request the department to conduct a
- 20 criminal history check on an applicant, employee, or volunteer
- 21 who has given written consent pursuant to subsection (1).
- (3) Upon request, the department shall conduct the criminal
- 23 history check and provide the results to the employer and to the
- 24 applicant, employee, or volunteer.
- 25 (4) The department shall prescribe the form of the request
- 26 and necessary information for a criminal history check pursuant
- 27 to this act.

- 1 Sec. 5. Except for a knowing or intentional release of
- 2 false information, the department and its employees have no
- 3 liability in connection with a criminal history check conducted
- 4 pursuant to this act.
