HOUSE BILL No. 5053

August 1, 1991, Introduced by Reps. Gilmer, Nye, Martin, Knight, Ostling and Bartnik and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to prescribe certain duties of persons who operate or utilize winter sports parks; to provide for the acceptance of certain risks by persons who utilize winter sports parks; and to prescribe liability for violation of this act.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 2 "winter sports liability act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Operator" means a person or entity who owns or controls
 5 or who has operational responsibility for a winter sports park.
- 6 (b) "Participant" means a person who engages in winter7 sports at a winter sports park.
- 8 (c) "Winter sports" means sledding, tobogganing, luge, ice
- 9 skating, or cross-country skiing, whether recreational or

- (d) "Winter sports park" means a building, facility, or
- 2 outdoors that provides an area specifically designed to be used
- 3 for winter sports by the public.
- 4 (e) "Spectator" means a person who is present in a winter
- 5 sports park only for the purpose of observing winter sports
- 6 activity, whether recreational or competitive.
- 7 Sec. 3. An operator shall do all of the following:
- 8 (a) Post notice of the duties and liabilities of a partici-
- 9 pant as prescribed by sections 4 and 5 in and around the winter
- 10 sports park in conspicuous places open to the public.
- (b) Maintain the stability and legibility of posted notices
- 12 under subdivision (a).
- (c) Exercise reasonable care in the maintenance and opera-
- 14 tion of a winter sports park for the protection of participants
- 15 and spectators.
- 16 Sec. 4. While in a winter sports park, a winter sports par-
- 17 ticipant shall do all of the following:
- (a) Maintain reasonable control of his or her speed and
- 19 course at all times.
- 20 (b) Read all posted signs and warnings.
- 21 (c) Maintain a proper lookout to avoid other participants
- 22 and objects.
- 23 (d) Accept the responsibility for knowing his or her own
- 24 ability to negotiate the intended direction of travel while
- 25 engaged in a winter sport and to engage in that winter sport
- 26 within the limits of that ability.

- 1 (e) Refrain from acting in a manner that may cause injury to 2 others.
- 3 Sec. 5. Each participant accepts the danger that inheres in
- 4 that winter sport insofar as the dangers are obvious and
- 5 necessary. Those dangers may include, but are not limited to,
- 6 injuries resulting from collisions with other participants or
- 7 spectators, injuries resulting from falls, and injuries involving
- 8 objects or artificial structures properly within the intended
- 9 travel of the participant that are not otherwise attributable to
- 10 the operator's breach of his or her common law duties.
- 11 Sec. 6. A participant or operator who violates this act is
- 12 liable for the loss or damage resulting from that violation.
