- 1 Sec. 3. (1) An individual who has sustained either of the 2 following is dead:
- 3 (a) Irreversible cessation of circulatory and respiratory4 functions.
- 5 (b) Irreversible cessation of all functions of the entire6 brain, including the brain stem.
- 7 (2) A determination of death shall be made in accordance
 8 with accepted medical standards.
- 9 (3) A physician or registered nurse may pronounce the death 10 of a person in accordance with this act.
