THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 224d of Act No. 328 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1931, as amended by Act No. 33 of the Public Acts of 1991,
- 3 being section 750.224d of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 224d. (1) As used in this section and section 224,
- 6 "self-defense spray device" means a device to which all of the
- 7 following apply:
- 8 (a) The device is capable of carrying not more than 35
- 9 grams of any combination of active and inert ingredients.

- 1 (A) -(b) The device IS CAPABLE OF CARRYING, AND ejects, 2 releases, or emits 1 of the following:
- 3 (i) Orthochlorobenzalmalononitrile NOT MORE THAN 35 GRAMS
- 4 OF ANY COMBINATION OF ORTHOCHLOROBENZALMALONONITRILE AND INERT
- 5 INGREDIENTS.
- 6 (ii) A solution containing not more than 2% oleoresin7 capsicum.
- 8 (B) -(c) The device does not eject, release, or emit any
- 9 gas or substance that will temporarily or permanently disable,
- 10 incapacitate, injure, or harm a person with whom the gas or sub-
- 11 stance comes in contact, other than the substance described in
- 12 subdivision $\frac{(b)(i)}{(a)}$ (A)(i) or (ii).
- 13 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person
- 14 who uses a self-defense spray device to eject, release, or emit
- 15 orthochlorobenzalmalononitrile or oleoresin capsicum at another
- 16 person is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for
- 17 not more than 2 years, or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or
- 18 both.
- 19 (3) If a person uses a self-defense spray device during the
- 20 commission of a crime to eject, release, or emit orthochloroben-
- 21 zalmalononitrile or oleoresin capsicum or threatens to use a
- 22 self-defense spray device during the commission of a crime to
- 23 temporarily or permanently disable another person, the judge who
- 24 imposes sentence upon a conviction for that crime shall consider
- 25 the defendant's use or threatened use of the self-defense spray
- 26 device as a reason for enhancing the sentence.

- 1 (4) A person shall not sell a self-defense spray device to a
 2 minor. A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a
 3 misdemeanor.
- 4 (5) Subsection (2) does not prohibit either of the 5 following:
- 6 (a) The reasonable use of a self-defense spray device by a
 7 law enforcement officer in the performance of the law enforcement
 8 officer's duty.
- 9 (b) The reasonable use of a self-defense spray device by a
 10 person in the protection of a person or property under circum11 stances which would justify the person's use of physical force.
