## **HOUSE BILL No. 5642**

March 9, 1992, Introduced by Reps. Bender, McBryde, Bodem, Allen, Randall, DeLange, Van Singel and Anthony and referred to the Committee on Conservation, Recreation and Environment.

A bill to provide for the removal of certain dead animals from certain areas open to vehicular traffic in this state; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2),
- 2 notwithstanding any other provision of law, as soon as practical
- 3 after receiving notice from a person, the department of natural
- 4 resources shall remove the carcass of a deer, bear, elk, or moose
- 5 from the traveled portion or the shoulder of any public roadway
- 6 or bridge in this state.
- 7 (2) The department of natural resources may enter into a
- 8 contract with the governing body of any county that seeks to
- 9 undertake in that county the responsibilities of the department
- 10 provided under subsection (1).

- 1 (3) Contracts authorized under subsection (2) shall be
- 2 negotiated by the department of natural resources with individual
- 3 counties and shall provide reasonable compensation to a county in
- 4 exchange for the service provided by a county.
- 5 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 6 (a) "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
- 7 association, governmental entity, or other legal entity.
- 8 (b) "Roadway" means the entire width between the boundary
- 9 lines of every way publicly maintained when any part is improved,
- 10 designed, or ordinarily used for public vehicular travel.
- 11 (c) "Shoulder" means that portion of the roadway that is
- 12 contiguous to the roadway and generally extends the contour of
- 13 the roadway and that is not designed for vehicular traffic but is
- 14 maintained for the temporary accommodation of disabled or stopped
- 15 vehicles otherwise permitted on the roadway.
