THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 (d) "Postconsumer waste" means newsprint that has served its

- (e) "Recycled content" means the proportion of fiber in
 newsprint that is derived from postconsumer waste measured as the
 average of the recycled content of all newsprint used by a person
 during the year.
- 9 Sec. 2. By January 1, 2000, and each year thereafter, any 10 newsprint used in this state shall contain at least 50% recycled 11 content.
- Sec. 3. A person who violates this act after receiving 13 written notice from the attorney general that the person is in 14 violation of this act is responsible for a civil fine of 15 \$1,000.00 per day of violation. In addition, the attorney gen-16 eral may seek injunctive relief to prevent the distribution in 17 this state of newsprint that is in violation of this act.
