HOUSE BILL No. 6049

September 15, 1992, Introduced by Reps. Bennane and Baade and referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

A bill to provide for the suspension of certain occupational licenses under certain circumstances and to provide for certain powers and duties for certain state agencies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "regulated occupation support enforcement act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "License" means a certificate, registration, or license
- 5 issued by an occupational regulatory agency which allows an indi-
- 6 vidual to engage in a regulated occupation or which allows an
- 7 individual to use a specific title in the practice of an occupa-
- 8 tion, profession, or vocation.
- 9 (b) "Occupational regulatory agency" means a department,
- 10 bureau, or agency of the state of Michigan that has regulatory
- 11 authority over a regulated occupation.

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- (c) "Office of the friend of the court" means the agency created pursuant to section 3 of the friend of the court act, Act No. 294 of the Public Acts of 1982, being section 552.503 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 5 (d) "Regulated occupation" means an occupation, profession,
 6 or vocation which requires a license as a predicate for the prac7 tice of the occupation, profession, or vocation or for the use of
 8 a specific title in the practice of the occupation, profession,
 9 or vocation.
- Sec. 3. An occupational regulatory agency shall suspend II pursuant to this act the license issued to an individual for a 12 regulated occupation.
- 13 Sec. 4. (1) Within 7 business days after receipt of a sus14 pension order issued pursuant to section 26 of the support and
 15 visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the Public Acts of
 16 1982, being section 552.626 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, an
 17 occupational regulatory agency shall send a written notice of the
 18 receipt of the suspension order to the licensee who is the
 19 subject of the order.
- (2) The notice sent pursuant to subsection (1) shall inform
 the licensee who is the subject of the suspension order that the
 coccupational regulatory agency shall comply with the suspension
 order issued by a court and shall automatically suspend the
 licensee's license within 28 days after the date of mailing of
 the notice unless the office of the friend of the court provides
 an order from the court indicating that the suspension order has
 been rescinded.

Sec. 5. (1) An occupational regulatory agency shall comply

- 2 with a suspension order and shall suspend the license of a
 3 licensee 28 days after the date of mailing of the notice pursuant
 4 to section 4 unless the office of the friend of the court pro-
- 5 vides an order from a court indicating that the suspension order 6 has been rescinded.
- 7 (2) An order rescinding a suspension order is effective
 8 immediately upon its entry by the court. An occupational regula9 tory agency shall reinstate the license of a licensee whose
 10 license is reinstated pursuant to section 26 of the support and
 11 visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the Public Acts of
 12 1982, being section 552.626 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. The
 13 effective date of reinstatement of the license is considered to
 14 be the date of entry of the order rescinding the suspension
- (3) An occupational regulatory agency shall send a notice of 17 reinstatement of a license to the licensee within 7 business days 18 after receipt of the order rescinding the suspension order.
